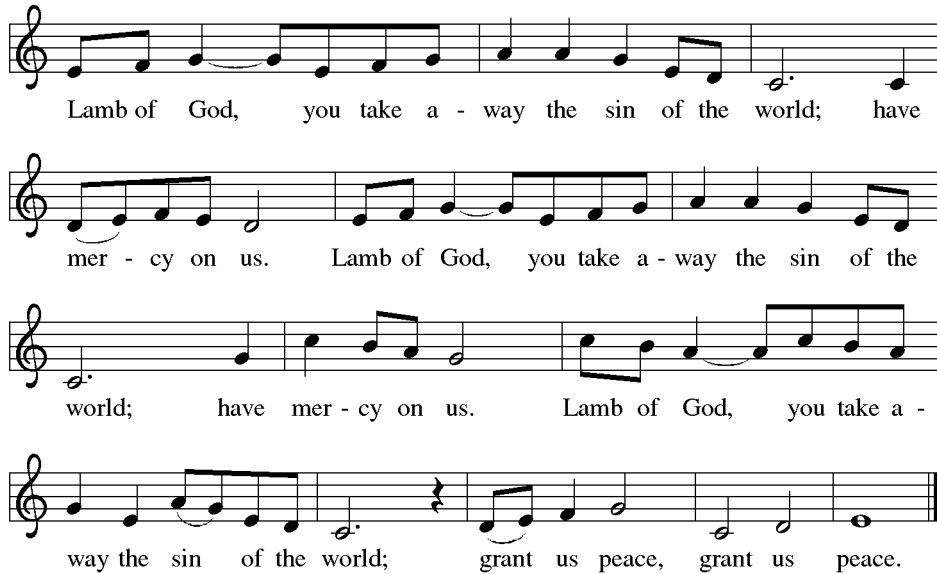
THE LORD'S PRAYER (spoken)
