Without Life Are We Like Old, Unused Barns?

There is a theory about old, unused barns. They depreciate and become run down quicker because they do not house livestock anymore. When there is no livestock, the barn dries out from the lack of moisture that the animals give off. This rots and subsequently decays the wood, which then buckles slowly under the pressure of gravity. Therefore, many unused barns have a sinking roof and begin to lean.

When our faith gets dried out by not being active, our self can be weaker under various pressures, too, like old, unused barns. Methodists proclaim that faith that is alive and vibrant is a faith worthy of striving for and living for. Faith without works is dead, says the book of James. And while we are not saved by our good works, an active faith is a good faith. While it does not give off moisture, like livestock in a barn, a strong faith gives off a good, life-giving spirit that not only nourishes us but also nourishes those around us. Vibrancy. Have you ever met a stranger on a sidewalk who simply smiled at you? Smiling can become contagious, and when met with a smile, it can take away our sour thoughts in the moment. Sharing the love of God with another works in the same way.

A good barn is a barn in use! And so it is with our faith, not as a couch potato, lifeless faith, but as an active faith that nourishes and strengthens. May this New Year ahead be a time to exercise your faith fully—perhaps in new and creative ways, or in much the same patterns as 2025. Such nourishing and strengthening, like the wood structure uplifted in a used barn, is our own nourishing and strengthening for being instruments that God can use in a weary world.



TUESDAY, November 19, 2024 (REVISED)



ATTENDANCE: Beth Hanggi (SPRC), Kelly Amunrud (Trust Fund), Lisa O'Neil (Ad Council Chairperson).

MEETING: Lisa called the meeting to order and opened the meeting with a prayer.

SECRETARY: The October Ad Council minutes were distributed. Motion was made to approve the minutes. Motion was seconded and approved.

TREASURER: End of October balance \$26,884.35. (Set aside for parsonage \$6,779.11) Memorial fund end of October balance \$18,667.42.

TRUST FUND: End of October balance \$85,593.91.

TRUSTEES:

Snow removal: We need someone to clear the back parking lot. Beth will call Jeremy Gnagy for a quote. Lisa will contact Colin to see if he would like us to have the sidewalks also. Motion was made to proceed.

Unknown vehicles: We have had unauthorized people using our parking lot. We have ordered two signs to place in the lot. If issues continue, we will contact the Sheriff's office for their assistance.

MEMORIAL:

Lapel microphone: Lisa and Pastor Chad looked in to options. It was decided to postpone this as there were no good options and his microphone is working at this time.

Gutters: Colin asked if we could use memorial funds to get leaf guards for the gutters for the flat part of the roof. We would also like to get larger gutters on the west side. Lisa will talk with Colin to get a quote from Craig Hester with Millennium Seamless Gutters. Motion was made to proceed.

SPRC:

Parsonage lawn: The parsonage tenants contacted us to let us know TruGreen sprayed and killed their plants. Beth will contact Alex Corey for a quote and obtain service for both the parsonage and the church. Lisa will cancel TruGreen.
