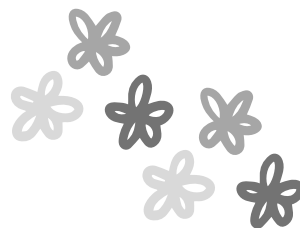

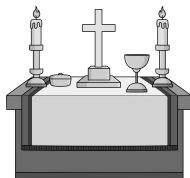
The Choir

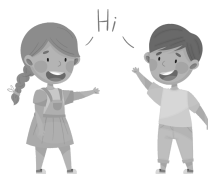

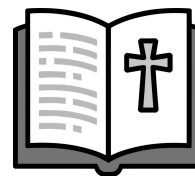
Flower Ministry

Developing a Spirituality of Invitation

How to Invite Someone to the Community

Did you know that God is forming a community whose mission is to welcome people from every nation, culture, and language? It's one of God's antidotes to the poison of sin and evil that divide and diminish us. God opens his arms to all his children and invites us into a single human family of justice, peace, and joy, with Jesus as its head. Your neighbour, your family, your co-workers – they're included. They just might not know it yet. And those of us who do know are called to share that invitation. **Here's how.**

1

Listen

The people in your life have a variety of needs. Some are thirsty for **friendship**. Some are hungry for **meaning** to their life. Some are craving inner **peace**. Some are **sad** or **angry** about what is **happening in the world**. Our job is to listen to what the people in our lives need, and respond with personalized invitations.

2

Personalize the Invitation

If you hear that someone in your life is anxious about the state of the world, say to them, **"I am too. This is why I go to church. It gives me an opportunity to pray for the world and consider what my role in the world is. Why don't you come with me sometime?"**

If someone is looking for friendship, say to them, **"I am part of a wonderful community that meets socially. Why don't you come with me some time?"**

Looking for peace?: **"I feel so much better after I listen to the music at church. Why don't you come with me some time?"**
