

*We sing twice through together.*

*Then we sing in a round (canon) with groups entering at the points marked A, and B.*

*A cantor sings a descant to the words:*

*“Rejoice, rejoice, Christ is born, Alleluia! Christ is born of the Virgin Mary.”*


*Officiant* O Lord, I call to you; come to me quickly;

as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.**

**Psalm 115 (Seated)**

*All sing the refrain **twice** at the beginning. As the leader speaks the verses of the psalm, we hum the refrain softly. At the marked points during the psalm, we sing the refrain with the words **once**.*



1 Not to us, O Lord, not to us, but to your name give glory; because of your love and because of your faithfulness.

2 Why should the heathen say, "Where then is their God?"

3 Our God is in heaven; whatever God wills to do comes to pass.

 17 The dead do not praise the Lord, nor all those who go down into silence;  
 18 But we will bless the Lord, from this time forth for evermore. Hallelujah! **REFRAIN**



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## Affirmation of Faith      Said by all, standing.





All sing the refrain **twice in English** at the beginning. As the leader speaks the verses of the psalm, we hum the refrain softly. Between the prayer petitions, we sing the refrain **once in Latin**.
