The next day John the Baptist saw Jesus coming toward him and declared, "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.' I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel." And John testified, "I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God." The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed,

"Look, here is the Lamb of God!" The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" (which translated means Teacher), "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come and see." They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon. One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. He first found his brother Simon and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which is translated Anointed). He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, "You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas" (which is translated Peter).

J.S. Bach 1685 – 1750

Bach's chorale prelude *In dir ist Freude* would likely have been played in Bach's period in Weimar as a way of introducing the hymn. Note how the Prelude is used as a way to conjure the mood of a piece ahead of singing.

At the start of the piece, we hear the descending 4 notes played clearly, surrounded by a jumping bass line which Bach uses as a re-occurring theme throughout the piece. Constant eighth movement leaping up and down speaks of the joy expressed in the hymn text.

Curiously, this hymn tune began life in 1591 as a popular secular Italian love dance, "A lieta vita amor ci invita" ([The affairs of] Love invites a merry life). German words attributed to Cyriacus Schneegäß, were written to this existing tune, and it was published as a Christmas carol in 1594.

The adaptation reflects a common practice in the Lutheran tradition of repurposing secular melodies for sacred purposes, a sentiment sometimes summarized by the (likely apocryphal) quote attributed to Martin Luther: "Why should the devil have all the good tunes?"


January 28th – First Children's Choir Choral Evensong @ 5:30pm
