Pastor's Pen

“I am no longer my own, but thine.

Dear Family and Friends,

We've spent some time with the theme of Covenant at the start of Epiphany. With the Wesleyan Covenant Service, followed by remembering our baptism with thanksgiving, blessing officers of the 2026 Leadership Team, along with all members who are committed to participating in Work Teams to support our LT, outreach, mission and ministries. Our next worship series includes a 4-week series from "What If Love..." (Part 2), "From Question to Covenant."

John Wesley adapted his Covenant prayer from the Puritan tradition that was so important to his parents, Samuel and Suzannah, and life in the Epworth rectory. It informed his theology and preaching. He expected the people called "Methodists" to pray this prayer at the beginning of each new year as a way of remembering and renewing their baptismal covenant.

The prayer describes the life of a participant with Christ in his mission. It

is a practical description of what Jesus was talking about when he said, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me" (Luke 9:23). Baptism marks the beginning of our life in Christ and his *ecclesia*, a people who "profess to pursue holiness of heart and life; universal love filling the heart and governing the life." The Covenant prayer helps us remember what the Jesus-way of life looks like and what loving God with all our heart, soul, strength and mind and loving our neighbor as ourselves requires of us.

When we pray this prayer, we remember that we are baptized. We renounce the spiritual forces of wickedness, reject the evil powers of this world, and repent of our sin. We accept the freedom and power God gives to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves. We confess Jesus Christ as our Savior, trust wholeheartedly in his grace, and promise to serve him as Lord, in union with the church. And we renew our promise to live as faithful members of Christ's church and serve as his representatives in the world.

This way of living and loving is possible only in a community centered in the life and mission of the crucified and risen Jesus Christ. Wesley and the early Methodists annually prayed the Covenant Prayer presuming everyone was part of a class meeting or band that met weekly for accountability and support for living this prayer. And everyone had a discipleship coach in their class leader who encouraged and prayed for them.

As we move into the second series in the "What if Love" sequence for worship, we will explore four pillars (core values) that represent the essence of who we are as United Methodists: Anchored in Faith; Deeply Rooted; Bravely Bridging; Boldly Sent. The first series answered, "The Why," this second series looks at "The What," and "The How" will come as our congregation embraces the invitation to commit to a new path guided by inclusivity, justice, and love. Mingled with these four pillars are four beliefs of the Christian faith: the incarnation, baptism, personal holiness and social holiness. These pillars of Oklahoma United Methodism will lead us toward the season of Lent, Holy Week, and Easter.

This series is designed to serve as a pathway to guide our congregation toward adopting the "What If Love Covenant." All OKUMC congregations are invited to bring their signed covenant to Annual Conference 2026. Where we will share together our commitment with a covenanting service. A cord of three strands is not quickly broken!

Meet Tonya Venable:




