

Day 13 — Faith That Seeks Wisdom

Scripture:

“If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives generously to all without finding fault.” — James 1:5

Devotional:

Wisdom is one of the greatest gifts God offers you — not just knowledge, but clarity, discernment, and understanding that goes beyond human logic. Wisdom helps you make decisions that align with God’s will. It protects you from unnecessary pain. It guides you into purpose. And the beautiful thing is this: God gives wisdom generously.

You don’t have to have everything figured out. You don’t have to pretend you know what to do. You don’t have to rely on your own understanding. God invites you to ask Him — and He promises to respond.

Reflection:

Guided Prayer:

Lord, I ask You for wisdom today. Give me clarity where I feel confused. Give me discernment where I feel uncertain. Guide my decisions, my thoughts, and my steps. Thank You for giving wisdom generously and without judgment. I trust Your guidance. Amen.

Daily Practice:

Pause before making one decision today — big or small.

Ask God: “Give me wisdom here.”
