*The Master's Mighty Message Part 8 | Luke 6:39-42*

*Jesus Imparts a Desperate Dependency:  
Because We Have Bad Teachers*

## **Read Luke 6:39-49**

1. How does Jesus' warning about blind guides in verses 39-40 logically follow His teaching on mercy, judgment, and love in Luke 6:27-38? What does this tell us about the kind of hearts that are vulnerable to bad teachers?
2. Jesus assumes that blindness is dangerous not only for the blind person, but for those who follow them. According to Scripture (e.g., 2 Cor. 4:4; Isa. 56:10; Matt. 15:14), why is spiritual blindness such a serious condition??
3. Jesus says, "Everyone when he is fully trained will be like his teacher." What does this reveal about discipleship being more than information transfer—more about formation than facts?
4. Beyond pastors and churches, who or what functions as a "teacher" in modern life (media, influencers, habits, institutions)? How do these teachers subtly shape what we love, fear, or trust?

5. Jesus says a disciple is not above his teacher. Why do we often assume we can consume ungodly or unbiblical influences without being shaped by them? Where have you seen that assumption fail—in your own life or others'?
6. Why is it easier to see sin clearly in others than in ourselves? How does this passage explain that problem as a teaching and heart issue, not merely a personality flaw?
7. Jesus does not forbid helping a brother with a speck—but He does forbid doing it blindly. What does this passage teach about the order of repentance and correction? Why does clarity in our own hearts matter before speaking into others' lives?
8. Jesus implicitly presents Himself as the only guide who truly sees. How do passages like John 8:12, Matthew 11:29, John 3:13, and John 14:6 reinforce this claim? What makes Jesus fundamentally different from every other teacher?
9. The sermon warned against living off borrowed theology and second-hand religion. What practices help ensure that Christ Himself—not merely Christian voices—remains your primary teacher?

10. If Jesus' call here is to leave blind guides and sit at His feet, what would that look like practically this week? Is there a voice, habit, or influence you need to loosen your grip on—or a rhythm of Scripture you need to strengthen?
