Discussion Questions

1. What is your experience with Artificial Intelligence (AI)? Is this something you intentionally interact with regularly? Has it helped you? Has it misled (or 'harmed') you? Describe what your approach or inclination is towards AI.
2. Read 1 Peter 1:3 - 4a. When discussing technology, and AI specifically, the future can seem to be full of loss, death, and decay. It can feel hopeless and helpless. How does this passage address those feelings? How do we continue to hold onto that Living Hope for ourselves and others when needed?
3. Do you think AI can help someone learn, pray, or read the Bible? In what ways can it be helpful and in what ways is it not helpful?
4. Before central heating, the hearth (or main fireplace) shaped how families gathered. It required effort, but it also *pulled people together* as everyone had a role to help keep it functional. In our lives today, what functions like a hearth? Something that naturally draws people together, that takes intentionality or effort, into community and connection? And what "furnaces" (comfortable, convenient technologies) might be quietly replacing those moments?
