Time for Centering

Today's Sermon — “*Thy Kingdom Come*”

When Jesus teaches us to pray, “*Thy kingdom come*,” he is inviting us into more than hope for a distant future. He is teaching us to desire—and to receive—God’s reign here and now. This Sunday we turn to **Luke 6:20–26**, where Jesus speaks words of blessing and warning that reverse the values of the world: blessing for the poor, the hungry, and the weeping; warning for the satisfied, the praised, and the secure.

In these words, Jesus shows us what life looks like when God’s kingdom draws near—and how unsettling that nearness can be. As **Dallas Willard** reminds us, “*The kingdom of God is the range of God’s effective will.*” To pray for the kingdom, then, is to ask that God’s will take effect not only in the world, but in our own lives—our loves, our loyalties, and our choices.

Long before us, **Augustine of Hippo** taught that when we pray “*Thy kingdom come*,” we are not asking God to do something new, but asking that the kingdom may *come to us*. God’s reign is sure; the deeper question is whether we are willing to live under it.

I pray that we hear Jesus’ challenging and hope-filled words, and that we learn what it means to pray—not only for heaven someday—but for God’s kingdom to take root among us now.

Attendance at last Sunday's service was 240; 201 joined online.

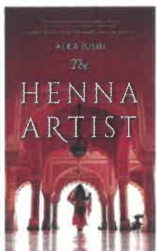

Legacy Endowment Fund – current balance \$378,952

The purpose of the Endowment Fund is to expand and enrich the mission of the congregation, to initiate new ministries or significantly change the scope of existing ministries. No more than 5% of the three year average fund assets may be distributed in any one year.

Memorial Garden Fund – current balance \$482,645

The purpose of the Memorial Garden Fund is to provide for the perpetual operation and maintenance of the Memorial Garden. Established in 1990, the Memorial Garden provides a resting place for the interment of the ashes of loved ones. It is open to current and former members and residents of Rio and Tonto Verde.

Scholarship Fund – current balance \$20,153

The Scholarship Fund promotes scholarships among young people involved in institutions we support through Mission giving. Recipients are chosen from applicants who are demonstrating academic excellence, commitment, and service in or to one of the following non-profit institutions or community: Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA), NPH (formerly Friends of the Orphans), Sunshine Acres. The Scholarship Fund's sole support is contributions from our members. Donors cannot be related to recipients.

Did you know?... If you are age 70 1/2 or older, you can make a gift from your IRA to support the church. It will not add to your federal taxable income; It counts toward your required minimum distribution, and allows you to experience a tax benefit, even if you do not itemize deductions. You should discuss any such gifts, before making them, with your financial advisor.

The church is very appreciative of gifts from trusts, foundations, and stocks. Occasionally, these gifts are received with no indication of who the donor is. So that we may properly recognize and record the gift, we ask that you either notify the church office or have your financial representative document the donor {and intent} when it is sent to us.

January 31, 2026


8:30 am ~ 2:30 pm
