


ALL SAINTS BY-THE-SEA

• *Indigenous Food Ways with Chris Arnett*

Tuesday, January 27th | 6:00 — 8 pm | \$15 to \$25

This evening's edition of "A History of Farming" on Salt Spring explores settler agriculture and the evolution of farming on the island.

Led by Usha Rautenbach and Charles Kahn, we will discuss the food systems introduced by settlers — including Hawaiian, Japanese, and Black farmers — and how their labour, skills, and crops shaped Salt Spring's agricultural landscape.

Drawing on archival research, lived experience, and the foundational work Farms Farmers Farming, 1859–1939 by agricultural historian Mort Stratton, the presentation traces Salt Spring's transformation into a regional agricultural hub by the turn of the 20th century.

During this period, the island earned a reputation as a bread basket of the province, with orchardists shipping thousands of forty-pound boxes of apples annually.
