

Restoring Dignity: A Call to Action for National Human Trafficking Awareness Month

This January, as our nation observes National Human Trafficking Prevention Month, we are called as a community of faith to look "beneath the surface" of a tragedy that often remains hidden in plain sight. Human trafficking is a crime against humanity and, for many in our community, an affront to the Gospel that denies the inherent value of every life created in the image of God.

Sex Trafficking 101: An Introduction

Human Trafficking is the fastest growing crime worldwide. Why? Simply put, drugs can be sold only once, but a human being can be sold multiple times a day. Unlike drug trafficking where the product has to be restocked, traffickers only have to keep victims alive to gain profit from them no matter their condition.

Since 2019, God has called Eight Days of Hope to stand in the gap for those who have been victims of sex trafficking. One of the ways we can do that is by helping you understand exactly what trafficking is.

So, what is sex trafficking?

Sex trafficking: a form of modern-day slavery in which individuals perform a commercial sex act that is induced by force, fraud, or coercion.

Through the Lens of a Victim

1. Force: When a victim is physically restrained, kicked, sexually assaulted, beaten, and/or strangled if they did not perform a commercial sex act.
2. Fraud: When a victim is deceived by false promises of employment, protection, love, marriage, or a better life and then forced to perform a commercial sex act.
3. Coercion: When a victim is threatened with serious harm, confinement, and/or rape if they do not perform a commercial sex act.

*The term "commercial sex act" means any sex act on account of which anything of value (money, rent, food, etc.) is given to or received by any person.

Supply and Demand

Sex trafficking is all about supply and demand, and involves a trafficker, a victim and a buyer. As long as there are people wanting to buy sex and pornography, there will be people looking to groom the next victim.

The average age of a victim in trafficking is 15 years old. (*2021 Federal Human Trafficking Report*)

The average “John,” or buyer, is a 40-year-old, married father of two who makes an average annual income of \$75,000–\$80,000. (*Familial Trafficking in the US, SAFE*)

How do we get to the point where a 15-year-old can be sold for sex?

The Trafficking Cycle

Traffickers literally play the “long game” by using proven methods of manipulation that can be described as a trafficking cycle.

Believe it or not, there are books that teach you how to become a trafficker. Right now, traffickers are actively looking for vulnerabilities and future victims to pull into the trafficking cycle.

1. Recruitment: traffickers identify men, women, or children who are vulnerable. They are looking for individuals that they can build an emotional connection with, and then manipulate that connection to repeatedly abuse the victim. **Common vulnerabilities: children in foster care, homes with substance abuse or financial hardship, single mothers, vulnerable adults.

2. Grooming: the process of establishing a relationship and emotional bond with a target victim to manipulate, exploit, or abuse them. These relationships may have the disguise of lover, provider, or protector.

3. Exploitation: a foundation of trust has been built by the trafficker, abuse begins, and the victim is sold for sex to benefit the trafficker.

The heartbreak reality?

Somebody's son or daughter is being sold over and over and over again...

A trafficking victim can be sold 5-6 times a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. That equals more than 12,000 sex acts a year.

The average quota per day is \$2,000, making the trafficker \$730,000 a year from just one victim.

Many never escape the cycle, but for those who do, hope and healing can be found through safe houses around the country. Eight Days of Hope has partnered with 13 organizations fighting for survivors to have a redeemed life each and every day.

We understand that this information is heartbreaking, but it's crucial for us to learn about what is happening to so many right this second. We must, as the body of Christ, keep our eyes wide open.





The Art of Wintering: Caring for Our Souls and Minds in the New Year

Message from Kerry Underwood

NEW!

As a new year begins, many of us feel an unspoken pressure to start strong. New Year, New YOU! We set ambitious goals, fix what feels broken, and push ourselves toward constant improvement. Yet winter has the ability to offer us a quieter, healthier invitation. The season of winter reminds us that slowing down is not a failure of faith or effort, but a vital part of how God designed us to heal and grow.

In the natural world, winter is a season of rest and conservation. Growth does not stop; it simply happens beneath the surface. In much the same way, our minds and spirits need seasons of reduced pace in order to recover from stress, grief, and exhaustion. Scripture affirms this rhythm when Jesus invites the weary to come to Him for rest (Matthew 11:28). Rest is not a luxury; it is a necessity for mental and spiritual wellbeing.

Wintering allows us to tend gently to our mental health. By honoring quieter rhythms, we give ourselves permission to pause, reflect, and acknowledge our limits. This can reduce anxiety, prevent burnout, and create space for emotional healing. Practices such as prayerful stillness, honest self-examination, and intentional rest help calm the mind and remind us that we are not alone in our struggles. God meets us not only in our strength, but also in our fatigue.

Spiritually, wintering nurtures trust. When we release the need to constantly produce or perform, we learn to rest in God's presence rather than our own abilities. "Be still, and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10) becomes an invitation to breathe, to listen, and to allow God's peace to steady our anxious thoughts. In this stillness, faith is often strengthened, not diminished.

As we enter this new year, wintering may look different for each person. It might mean simplifying schedules, setting healthier boundaries, seeking support when needed, or choosing rest without guilt. These are not signs of weakness; they are acts of wisdom and faithful self-care. When we honor winter seasons, we prepare our hearts and minds for renewed strength and future growth.

God's promise remains: "Those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength" (Isaiah 40:31). Winter will not last forever. But when we embrace this season with intention and trust, we allow God to restore us—mentally, emotionally, and spiritually—in ways that sustain us for the journey ahead. Now that is a "New Year, New You" I can get behind!

A Prayer for the New Year

Gracious and loving God,
As we step into this new year, we come to You weary, hopeful, and in need of Your peace. Teach us to embrace seasons of rest without guilt and to trust that You are at work even when life feels slow or uncertain. Quiet our anxious thoughts, heal our tired minds, and restore our spirits. Help us to care for ourselves as You care for us—with compassion, patience, and grace. May this season of wintering draw us closer to You and prepare us for the new life You are bringing forth. Amen.
