INSURANCE UPDATE:

2026 Insurance Renewal

Archdeacon Stephen shared that the renewal for 2026 the Insurance Subcommittee met yesterday with representatives from AON to go over the 2026 Renewal.

Renewal info shared with Council:

- Insurance coverage is now bonded for 2026.
- fairly benign renewal
- Boiler reference on invoice- means equipment electrified or heat producing (not covered under property insurance)
- PSA - Physical/Sexual Abuse coverage increase to \$800/certificate
- General liability is a 10% increase
- Director & Officers has a decrease in the premium (\$5k cheaper)
- Broker fees only increased by the rate of inflation
- Overall increase is approximately 3.2%
- If you have specific questions about coverage please speak to Helen or Stephen
- Helen has done an immense amount of work to assist us in our coverage for accuracy of insurable needs.
- Invoices will be sent directly to parishes, but we do not know of exact timing yet

Archdeacon Stephen will send out more information (via email) once he knows more.

Following consultations held at the deanery level, Jacqueline Davison, Director of Finance and Archdeacon Tanya Phibbs shared with Diocesan Council the final draft of the 2026 Budget and 2026 Apportionment calculations.
