

Day 17 — Faith in Your Purpose

Scripture:

“For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them.” — Ephesians 2:10

Devotional:

You were created with intention. You are not an accident, a mistake, or an afterthought. God designed you with purpose woven into your identity. Before you were born, He prepared good works for you — assignments, moments, relationships, and opportunities that only you can fulfill.

Purpose is not always loud or dramatic. Sometimes it's quiet — found in the way you love people, the way you encourage others, the way you show up, the way you serve, the way you reflect God's heart in everyday moments. Purpose is not about platform; it's about obedience. It's not about being seen; it's about being faithful.

You may not always feel purposeful. You may have seasons where you feel lost, unsure, or disconnected. But purpose is not a feeling — it's a truth. God placed gifts inside you. He placed compassion, strength, creativity, wisdom, and resilience in you. He placed a calling on your life that cannot be canceled by mistakes, delays, or detours.

Sometimes purpose unfolds slowly.
Sometimes it shifts as you grow.
Sometimes it surprises you.
Sometimes it stretches you.
Sometimes it requires you to step out of comfort and into faith.

But purpose always aligns with God's heart. It always leads you closer to Him. It always impacts others in ways you may never fully see.

Today, God wants to remind you that your life carries meaning. You matter. Your presence matters. Your voice matters. Your obedience matters. You are His workmanship — handcrafted, intentional, and deeply valued.

Reflection:

Where do you sense God calling you to make an impact?
What gifts or passions has He placed inside you that you've overlooked or minimized?

Purpose grows when you stop doubting what God has placed in you.

Guided Prayer:

Lord, thank You for creating me with purpose. Help me see myself the way You see me. Reveal the assignments You've prepared for me and give me the courage to walk in them. Use my life for Your glory. Amen.

Daily Practice:
