

Vicar's Voice



Look directly at the SON!

“Let there be light!” With those words on Day 1 of Creation, God spoke **everything into existence**. To say that light is both significant and essential is a gross understatement. Our lives depend on light.

Let's work from the physical and move toward the **spiritual aspects** of this. The sun's distance from **earth is just right**. If the sun were any closer or any further away, we would not survive the extreme conditions –**burning up or freezing solid**.

Our need for physical **light is tangible** - especially at this time of year

when the daylight hours are shorter. The winter grey skies do affect our **moods and outlook**. Many of us avail ourselves of special mechanical lights which provide the specific light that we require.

Physiologically, our bodies are designed **to receive Vitamin D** when our skin is exposed to **Sun light**. Workers in Polar areas are sent south for intentional vacations as they need to see the Sun. Some of us suffer from **SAD (Seasonal Affected Disorder)**. Light is essential in plant life. The process of photosynthesis occurs when a plant receives the sunlight and converts into chemical energy!

Science class over...let's move on! Throughout Scripture, “**light**” is a prominent theme. **God's glorious perfection is Light**. When Moses would return from a mountaintop encounter with God, his face shone –reflecting God's glory. **This same Glorious light** guided the people on their way. **Psalm 119** reminds us that “**God's word is a lamp to our feet and light to our path.**” Throughout the ages, the light of God's word has and does provide direction, **correction and consolation to us**.

In the New Testament, Jesus says “**I am the light of the world!**”(John 8:12) The light of Christ shows the way **giving us hope**. His light reveals truth. When we allow Jesus light to shine His light into our hearts, He shows us the areas which require his **work and transformation**. Also, in **1 John 1:7**, the Scripture tells us that when we walk in the **Light of Christ**, we have fellowship with one another as we share the common light and life of Jesus.

More than ever, we need the guiding light of Jesus. Many of us are discouraged and **cast down for various reasons**. In many cases, our vision and ability to see possibilities has been **clouded by fear, anxiety and exhaustion**. Looking directly into the light of the sun, will blind us. But, in a stunning paradox, looking directly into the light of the Son, will bring **clarity to our vision and healing to us all**.

In this extended “**winter season**,” I encourage you to open your eyes to see allow the light of Christ to shine. His light will and does **restore hope and joy to our hearts and souls**.
