## Lesson: God Makes Things New

### **Big Idea:**

God makes things new—just like snow.

### **Scripture:**

“See, I am making all things new.”

Revelation 21:5

(Younger kids: “God makes things new.”)

### **Leader says:**

Q: Who saw the snow today?

Snow can stop school and church... but it also makes everything look NEW!

### **Say Together:**

“God makes things new!”

## Visual Object Lesson

What you need (choose 1):

- Picture of a snowy yard, hopefully we can look out our window 😊
- White paper over a messy drawing
- Cotton balls (fake snow)

Leader explains:

Before snow, things can look messy or dull.

After snow, everything looks clean, calm, and beautiful.

Connect to God:

God does that too.

God brings new days, new hope, and new beginnings.

## Experiment

Clear Water → Dirty Water → Clean Water

Supplies:

- 2 clear cups/jars
- Clean water
- Dirt or pepper
- Coffee filter or paper towel

How to Do It:

1. Clean: Show clear water  
“This looks clean.”

2. Dirty: Add dirt/pepper and stir  
“Now it’s messy.”
3. Clean Again: Slowly pour through the filter  
“Look — it’s clean again!”

Connection:

God brings renewal and new beginnings. God makes things new.

## **Scripture**

Read aloud:

“See, I am making all things new.” – Revelation 21:5

Explain simply:

Even when things stop or change—God is still at work.

## **Age-Flexible Discussion (Pick what fits)**

For Littles:

- What color is snow?
- Does snow make things look new?

For Elementary:

- Why do people like fresh starts?
- How does snow change everything?

For Older Kids:

- Why do we like new beginnings?
- How can God help us when things feel stuck or slow?

## Craft/Activity Options

### Snowflake Craft:

Write or draw: “God makes things new.”

### Movement Activity:

Crouch down (quiet winter) → stand tall (new day!)

### Family Option:

Look outside at the snow and talk about how God brings new beginnings.

## Optional Home Family Fun

### Option 1: Instant “Snow”

Supplies: baking soda, white hair conditioner (or shaving cream), bowl, spoon

Steps:

1. Put 3 cups of baking soda in a bowl.
2. Add  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup conditioner (add a little at a time).
3. Mix until it feels like packable snow.

Tie-in lesson discussion:

Snow feels new and clean. Today snow reminds us: “God makes things new.” (Rev. 21:5)

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### Option 2: “Melting Snow” Race

Supplies: 2 bowls of snow/ice (or crushed ice), salt, warm water, timer

Steps:

1. Put equal snow/ice in both bowls.
2. Bowl A: add 1–2 tablespoons of salt.
3. Bowl B: leave plain.
4. Watch which melts faster (time it).

Tie-in lesson discussion:

Sometimes things change fast, sometimes slow—God is with us in every season.

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### Option 3: Snowstorm in a Jar

Supplies: clear jar, water, baby oil, white paint, Alka-Seltzer (optional), glitter (optional)

Steps:

1. Fill the jar  $\frac{3}{4}$  water.
2. Add oil near the top.
3. Add a few drops of white paint (makes “snow” blobs).
4. Optional: drop in a small piece of Alka-Seltzer for a snowstorm effect.

Tie-in lesson discussion:

Snow falls and covers everything—God can refresh and renew our hearts.
