

Day 19 — Faith for Breakthrough

Scripture:

“See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?” — Isaiah 43:19

Devotional:

Breakthrough often begins quietly — long before you see the results. God works beneath the surface, shifting things, aligning things, healing things, preparing things. Sometimes breakthrough looks like sudden change, but more often it's the result of God's steady, unseen work over time.

You may feel stuck, delayed, or overlooked. You may feel like you've been praying for the same thing for a long time. But God is not ignoring you. He is not withholding out of cruelty. He is preparing something new — something better than what you lost, something deeper than what you imagined, something stronger than what you prayed for.

Breakthrough requires faith.

Faith to believe again.

Faith to hope again.

Faith to try again.

Faith to trust again.

Faith to expect God to move.

Sometimes the enemy tries hardest right before breakthrough.

Sometimes discouragement increases right before change.

Sometimes pressure intensifies right before release.

Sometimes things look worse right before they get better.

But God is faithful. He finishes what He starts. He fulfills what He promises. He opens doors no one can shut. He makes a way where there was no way.

Today, God is whispering, *“I am doing a new thing.”* Even if you can't see it yet, something is shifting. Something is breaking open. Something is being restored. Something is being released.

Reflection:

Where do you need breakthrough in your life?

What new thing might God be trying to birth in you or around you?

Breakthrough begins with expectation.

Guided Prayer:

Lord, I believe You are doing a new thing in my life. Open my eyes to see it. Strengthen my faith to expect breakthrough. Remove anything that stands in the way of what You are doing. I trust Your timing and Your power. Amen.

Daily Practice:

Declare aloud: *“God is working. Breakthrough is coming.”*
