COMMUNION


All are welcome to Christ's table!





John 3:1-21



Pray: Light a candle and open your devotion time with a prayer.

Holy God, pour out your Holy Spirit on us, and make us new creations each day, born again out of your eternal love for us. Invite us deeper into the mystery of your world-transforming presence, that we might follow you more closely. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.



Read: Read the key verse from Sunday's reading.

Jesus answered, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. (John 3:5)



Reflect: Reflect on the scripture summary.

A Jewish leader seeks Jesus under cover of night to ask him the questions which plague his mind, safe from the criticism of his colleagues. What he gets is an education in keeping things hidden.



Connect: Connect in conversation with others in your household.

- What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?
- In baptism, we die to the old self to be born anew. What needs to die within you so that God can create new life there?
- What would you ask Jesus if you could meet him in the middle of the night?

For the littles: Are you afraid of the dark?



Bless: Close your devotion with a blessing.

May God give you new life in water and Spirit. Amen.



Do: By acting on what we learn, we make God's word come alive. Do the following activity this week.

Go swimming. As you swim, consider Jesus' blessings given in baptism.
