Scripture: Genesis 24, Romans 12:1-21

1 - Become a person of prayer.

Genesis 24

*John 14:13-14 13 You can ask for anything in my name, and I will do it, so that the Son can bring glory to the Father. 14 Yes, ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it!*

**Taking It Home**

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Read Psalm 139:1-18

David has recognized that God sees all the things that fill his life. And in a sense starts making room. In what ways do you see him making room?

Psalm 139 reveals God is all-seeing, all-knowing, all-powerful, and everywhere present. God knows us, God is with us, and his greatest blessing is to allow us to know him. Knowing this truth, where can you make room for God? Or if God were to speak directly, where would He say to start?

What benefits do you see happening in the Psalm that can only happen when a person makes room for God?

If God fearfully and wonderfully made you, in what ways do you think He included space for Him to work?
