Historical Information

January 1893 – Stephen Methodist Church was formed in the Schulenburg community. The first pastor was The Reverend Bank Stephen. The church began on Eilers Street, but in 1939 the original church building was moved to its present location at 309 Wolters Avenue which was land donated by Reverend Stephen. During this period, the church was renamed to Stevens Chapel Methodist Church and in 1968 when the Methodist churches merged the denomination was then called United Methodist Church. Another transformation happened and the church is known today as: Stevens Chapel United Methodist Church (UMC). This church continues to transform throughout its long history of church existence. Stevens Chapel UMC will celebrate one hundred and thirty one (131) years of faithful Christian service this year and stands today as a testament of God's grace, mercy, and goodness along with a small membership that believes in the church's positive impact in the community of Schulenburg, Texas of Fayette County!


TRANSFORMATION
