

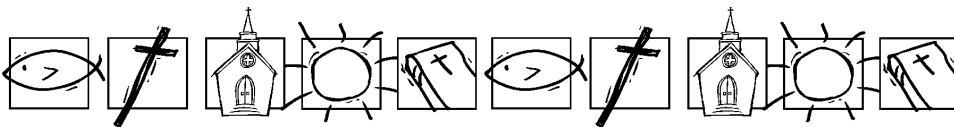

Pantry item: WV Pantry item for the month of February is laundry detergent. Christ Open Market needs are cereal, canned fruit, canned meats, snacks and juice.

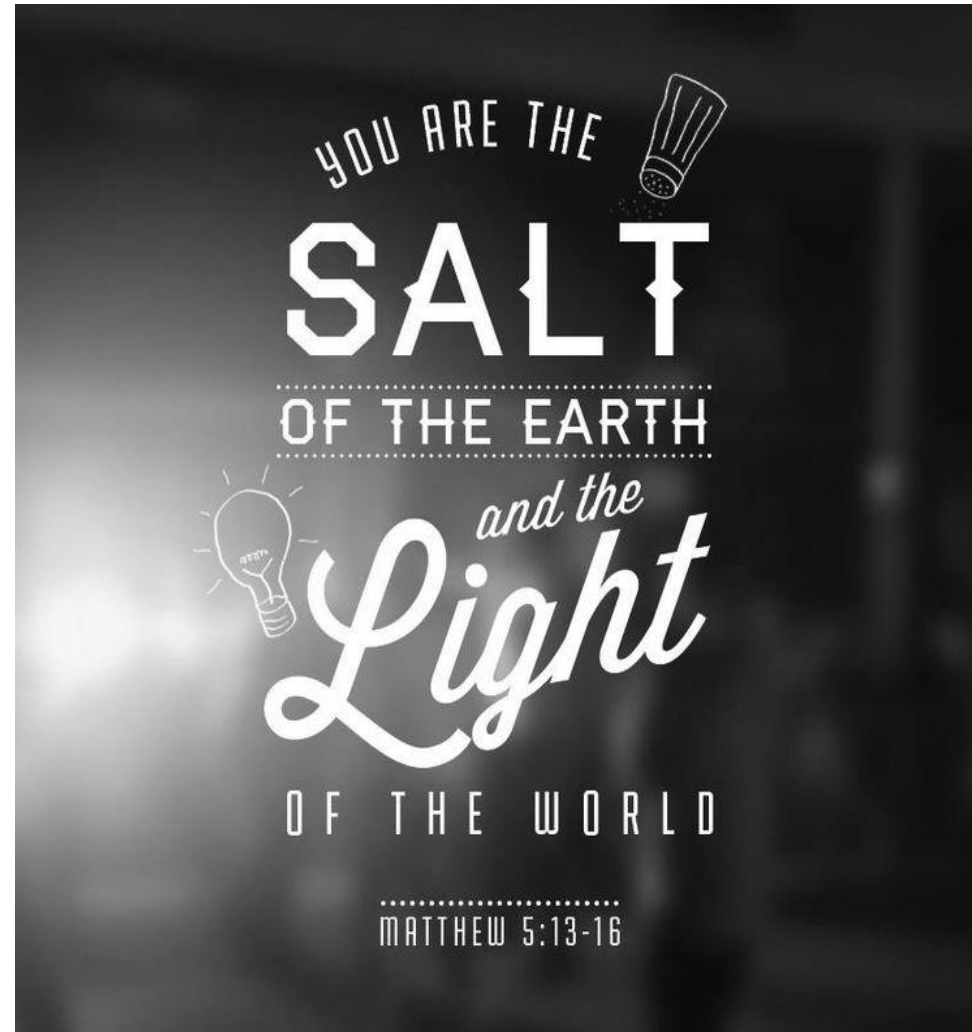
Blanket Sunday: Began on February 1st as we joined with other churches to make a difference for millions of people through \$10 gifts to Church World Service.
