### Opening prayer

God of Mercy, for generation after generation when your people have been faced with difficulty and hardship they gather together to worship and pray. Send we pray your Holy Spirit upon us gathered here today. Kindle your way of peace. Speed your holy justice. Stand with those living in fear. Encourage us to be your light and love, your courageous disciples to all our neighbors. May we not lose hope that peace and shalom can blanket this earth and this

community here and now. Let the church say. Amen.

Prayer for our Community (Hebrews 10:23-35)

Holy God, your servant Paul encourages us to provoke one another. He calls us to provoke one another to love and do good deeds. Amidst the real tension and real fear, help us to do this—provoke one another to love and good deeds. On the night of his arrest and betrayal as he washed his disciples feet Jesus gave his followers a new commandment—love one another, by this everyone will know you are my disciples, if you have love for one another. God, help us to love, help us to be your body at work in our community today as we seek to love all our neighbors. Bless the good deeds of those delivering food, driving people to and from work and school. Bless the efforts of those trying to keep us safe.

Bless the generosity of this community we call home that it may be a true reflection of your love for all your people. Help us to be your beloved community in this time and this place. Lord in your mercy... hear our prayer.

Prayer for Neighbors (Matthew 22:34-40)

God of compassion, you are infinite, beyond measure and outside our ability to imagine. The vastness of your way can never be contained. And yet we try. We try to limit the places you have called us. We try to narrow the expectations you place on us. We try to justify our actions that

don't match your way. Jesus knew this. He knew when the Pharisees asked about the greatest commandment that it was a trap—their attempt to discredit him and his teaching—and yet your son wasn't dissuaded. Jesus forthrightly said loving God and loving neighbors are joined—they cannot be separated—and together they establish the foundation of everything else. When we're honest, we know we, too, look for ways around loving our neighbors. Forgive us, O God. When we are tempted to forget and narrow our definition of neighbor, remind us that we don't have to agree with our neighbors and we don't have to even like our neighbors, but we do have to love them. We have to work for their wellbeing and want the same things for neighbors near and far that we want for ourselves and our children. When we see neighbors, sharpen our eyes until we see you in their place. Lord in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Prayer for Wisdom (James 3:13-18)

God of truth, we come before you as people who have too often lost our way. We think we can devise our own truth, shaping it to match our own agenda, our own values. We allow fear and mistrust to cloud our sense of what is right. We think the laws of supply and demand or the market or private investment or the government has the capacity to fix our problems and make our world right.

In our more reflective moments, when we catch a glimmer of your way, we know our earthly ways fall short, and yet we don't change. We cling to our broken ways and close our hearts to what you tell and show us over and over again. Forgive us, O God. Remind us that your wisdom, wisdom that comes to us from above and is beyond our own ways is marked by gentleness, mercy, integrity, and peace. Let that be the measure of our individual and collective actions and commitments. Prod us until we open our imaginations to your wisdom and then stir up in us the willingness to live accordingly. Lord in your mercy, hear our prayer.

### Prayer for Children (Matthew 18:1-5)

God of love, in your infinite wisdom, you entered our world as a baby, as a child needing love, tenderness and safety. Too often, though, your children today live with fear, isolation, with little hope for the future. There are young people today who have experienced multiple episodes of gun violence, and way too many of them haven't survived. Children are born and spend their childhoods in refugee camps, amid the violence of war and persecution, and in unspeakable poverty. Some children have so much that it never seems enough and their lives become an endless pursuit of entitlement. Forgive us, O God. Forgive our neglect of the young people who depend on us. Help us to reorient our priorities so we protect children as the blessings they are, as our collective path to the future. When we are tempted to forget, remind us that your son once said that unless we change and become like a child—creative, inquisitive, adventurous—we will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Remind us over and over again that the true measure of a society's health and prosperity is found in its commitment to children. Lord in your mercy, hear our prayer.

### Prayer for Peace (Romans 12)

God, we remember how at Christmas you came into our world as Emmanuel, God with each and every one of us. The prophet Isaiah called him the Prince of Peace. Speed your way of peace in our world, in our community, in our hearts. Too many lives have been disrupted, O God, too many people are living in fear. Too many people are caught in a system that is not working. Speed your way of peace. Keep us from looking at one another as enemies. Do not let hatred and evil infect our hearts and souls. Speed your way of peace. Send your peace to the Good and Pretti families. Send your peace to law enforcement called to do an impossible job. Send your peace to those seeking to deescalate tension so that more innocent lives are not lost. Help us to live as your peacemakers. Help us to hold fast to love and justice. 

Approval of Agenda: Motion to approve the agenda made by Lance. Second by David. Passed by Council

Approval of Dec 16, 2025 Council Minutes: Motion to approve the December council minutes made by Angie second by Deb. Passed by Council

Treasurer's Report—Missy—Motion to approve the Treasurer's Report made by Lance. Second by Angie. Passed by Council. Looking at the 2025 year: ended with a surplus of close to \$8000. All missions and all bills were paid in full in December. Council Discussion and recommendation with Missy occurred regarding distribution of the Endowment Fund proceeds: The Investment Committee decided they would disburse 6% of the funds which was \$62,255. The decision by the committee was made due to the growth of the fund in 2025. (Council determines the ways those funds are to be allocated.) Discussion occurred about how to split those funds. Motion made by David: \$20,000 to Endowment Grant and the balance to the General Fund. Lance made 2nd, Passed by Council.

Agenda approval for the Annual Meeting to be held on February 1, 2026. Motion made by David and second by Deb H. Passed by Council.

Minister for Community Update—Marie—Team: Alan T, Marie E, Suzanne H, Kathy R, Chris M, Carol M. A candidate will be meeting with members of the committee and personnel on Friday, Feb. 13th. Discussion about why not all of the members of the committee were invited to the interview. Marie will follow up with Alan regarding that question.

Christian Education (Angie) - Fused glass project—hopefully installed by Easter. Dates: Ash Wednesday after service. Additional dates have not been set up.

Deacons (Lance) - May need a long-term sub to assist with Deacons obligations

Endowment Grant (Norma) - 2nd Sunday April, July, October and December. \$500.00 spent so far in 2026.
