



INCUMBENT'S MESSAGE

BEING MISSIONAL

As we prepare for our Annual Meeting and look ahead to our tasks in this new year of 2026, I can report that we will be offering a workshop on Saturday March 21st to meet with some diocesan coaches who will lead us in the subject of Mission. It is no coincidence that our Annual Meeting is on the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, our parish patron. In the context of the “Communion of the Saints”, we ask him to join with us in prayer that the Parish of St. Paul’s would reflect his holy zeal in proclaiming the Gospel of Christ to his world.

There is no subject under the heading of Faith that seems to daunt Christians so much as evangelism. This is particularly so for Anglican Christians. We tend to leave the topic aside for the fundamentalists, so that we can continue with our mute, cautious piety. And yet, the mission to spread the Gospel is at the core of what it means to be a Christian disciple. At this very moment, in Nigeria, China, Iran, Pakistan and other countries, Christians are giving their lives to be faithful to the command that Jesus gave his disciples in [Mark 16:15](#), “...Go into all the world and preach the Gospel to all creation...” Can we continue to play it safe in the West when they are sacrificing everything for Christ?

How do we begin to change our behaviour in this matter? Two things spring to mind. On the 25th of January we followed the readings from the Third Sunday after the Epiphany. The feast of St Paul’s conversion has been transferred to the next day, Monday. But I’d like to take some time to share the first reading from that feast, [Acts 26:9-23](#) where Paul testifies to King Agrippa and speaks of why he has been arrested. Paul starts by explaining how he had been an enemy of Christ and the church until the Damascus experience when he met the Lord Jesus and was given a commission to preach the Gospel to the Gentiles. This encounter with the

Risen Lord transformed him and he proclaims the truth to the King so passionately that Festus the governor interrupts him and accuses him of insanity. Paul has simply told the court his own story of how the Lord turned him around.

How do we apply this to our own lives? Paul’s testimony contains those two things: Each one of us needs to experience the call of Jesus in our time and space and then tell the story of what He has done for us. This is our calling as disciples and our mission as a church. It is sometimes summarized as BC/AD: we share our own state of mind prior to meeting the Risen Lord, then show how His transforming love gave us a new life. That is exactly what Paul did before Festus and King Agrippa. The only insanity in the court was displayed by Agrippa and Festus: they thought they could avoid conversion and cheat death. The definition of insanity according to A.A. is expressed in this way: to continue to do what we have always done and expect different results.

In 2026, let’s take the risk of doing something different. Our broken world continues to unravel before our very eyes. May we be true disciples of Christ and proclaim the story of what He has done for us and so fulfil our calling and the vision and mission of St. Paul’s Anglican Church.



Historic time for Anglicans worldwide

The Installation of the 106th Archbishop of Canterbury, Sarah Mullally, will mark the first time a woman has held the office in 1,400, years.

The installation, called an enthronement, will take place at Canterbury Cathedral in southeastern England, on Wednesday March 25, 2026, the Feast of the Annunciation, which celebrates the day the Angel Gabriel told Mary she would be the mother of Jesus.

The service will mark the symbolic start of the Archbishop of Canterbury's public ministry across the Anglican Communion.

Rooted in centuries of tradition, the service will look forward with the hope of Jesus Christ - and celebrate the diversity of the Anglican Communion today.

The choice of Archbishop Sarah, 63, for the new role was announced in October of 2025. She legally became the Archbishop of Canterbury at her Confirmation of Election at St. Paul's Cathedral in London on Jan. 28.


She was the Bishop of London since 2018 - the first woman appointed to that role. Prior to her ordination in 2001, she was the Government's Chief Nursing Officer for England – the youngest person ever to be appointed to that role at the age of 37 – having previously specialized as a cancer nurse. She has described nursing as “an opportunity to reflect the love of God.”

She is widely perceived as an advocate for openness and inclusion.

The Archbishop of Canterbury's ministry combines many roles including *primus inter pares* - or first among equals - of the Primates of the global Anglican Communion, which consists of approximately 85 million people, across 165 countries, including Canada. About every 10 years, the Archbishop of Canterbury convenes the Lambeth Conference, a meeting of worldwide Anglican bishops.

She succeeds Justin Welby, who stepped down in November after a report criticized the church's handling of sexual abuse allegations.

“I look forward to sharing this journey of faith with the millions of people serving God and their communities in parishes ... across the global Anglican Communion.”



The first female Archbishop of Canterbury, Sarah Mullally, took over the role at the end of January with a formal ceremony to take place March 25.

“As I respond to the call of Christ to this new ministry, I do so in the same spirit of service to God and to others that has motivated me since I first came to faith as a teenager,” said the new Archbishop. “At every stage of that journey, through my nursing career and Christian ministry, I have learned to listen deeply - to people and to God’s gentle prompting - to seek to bring people together to find hope and healing.

“I want, very simply, to encourage the Church to continue to grow in confidence in the Gospel, to speak of the love that we find in Jesus Christ and for it to shape our actions. And I look forward to sharing this journey of faith with the millions of people serving God and their communities in parishes all over the country and across the global Anglican Communion.

“I know this is a huge responsibility, but I approach it with a sense of peace and trust in God to carry me as He always has.”


Serving up holiday spirit

Bursting Forth: An Epiphany Reflection

Epiphany is an opportunity to read and learn how the spirit of the law, the new life that Jesus came to proclaim, spreads throughout the world. This Epiphany is all about the Truth being revealed. It is a Truth that not everyone welcomes the same way - when Jesus reveals the wisdom of the scrolls, or when he tells us we must love those who wish us harm - these are hard truths to accept. It's not all wedding wine and divine blessings in the Temple - Truth settles on each of us.

The thing about the Truth that Jesus brings is that it is so wonderful, so different, so transformative, that it needs to be shared. It can barely be contained. Our hearts, our mouths, our souls cannot hold back. "Tell out my soul," Mary sang to the Angel. It is as if to say, I have learned something so beautiful that I simply must share it, it is impossible to keep to myself.

The Epiphany asks much of us. It asks us to reflect on an internal moment of awareness, of spiritual awakening, and find the words and ways to share it with the world. As Christ is made manifest to the whole world, unbound by social convention, religious authority, or political geography, we too are called to seek the neighbor beyond our immediate vicinity to accompany, to teach, to love.

The theological mystery of the Epiphany calls us to have one foot in the spiritual, deeply personal realm of revelation and the other foot in the world, learning how to seek and serve those who most need our help. We learn about the movement of the Spirit through Jesus and are motivated into ministering with him to the outcast, the stranger, and to those who most need to feel the warmth and light of His love. 






Story of hope told in pageant




