Amen!




May you be held in the warm love of Christ in these cold winter days and I look forward to worshiping with you on Sunday. Jill


I will always try to have worship. BUT, on those occasions when the weather is not in our favor and we need to close the building; we will post our decision by 6 a.m. on our website and Facebook.

February 2026 Zoom Prayer Meeting for Laity and Clergy

So much is happening in our world, and many days I am lost as to what God wishes me to do. One day, things seemed so overwhelming I found myself crying. As the tears began to fall, I was reminded that while I am a person of hope, I am only human. I surrendered to my own expectations and allowed myself to give in to my sadness.

In the shortest verse of Scripture we are given a powerful truth:

“Jesus wept.”

Jesus did not rush past sorrow or pretend it was not there. He stood in the midst of loss and let love be seen in his tears.

Jesus came as one of us to show us how to live in times and places when things are not as we might hope. Jesus suffered and yet still chose love. Love is both beautiful and sometimes tattered. Love can be seen in the messiness of birth and the brokenness of death. It was found in Jesus’ healing and performing miracles, as well as the agony of the cross.

The sharing of our wounds enables us to heal; it also helps others to heal when they know we have also suffered. It can be the way that we bear one another’s burdens and facilitate healing; this is love at work among us.

As Christians, we are not called to unrealistic expectations; we need space to be human, to slow down, to listen, and to allow the love of God to shape how we live and serve. It is our hope that these prayer sessions will offer us just that opportunity.

When we gather to pray, we come not as people who have it all together, but as people who trust that God meets us even in our tears and carries us into love for the world.


MERCY CENTER
