What does 'Septuagesima' mean? It means 'seventy' – the 70th day before Easter. Septuagesima marks a turning point in the Church year. We move from the Season of Epiphany toward the Season of Lent – From reflecting on the Manger to focusing on the Cross. The three 'gesima' Sundays give a warning that Lent is coming; and so the Altar is dressed in purple, the colour of penitence.



Daily Bread

How God Uses His Word to Transform Hearts:

Reading the Bible daily not only helps me when I feel down. It also allows me to listen to the Spirit of God even more,” **Marvin Williams** said (church Pastor).

One such time happened when he was **reading the book of Genesis**. I was a martial artist and won a lot of trophies. I remember literally walking into tournaments thinking, ‘Who’s going to get second place,’ ” he said. “But then one day, I reread the story of Abraham and his son, Isaac. How God tells Abraham to sacrifice Isaac to see how obedient and faithful he would be, and Abraham says he’ll obey.

In the story, which is found in **Genesis 22**, God eventually stops Abraham from going through with the sacrifice.

God tells Abraham, ‘Now I see that you will not even withhold your son from me’ (**Genesis 22:12**), and the Holy Spirit pressed on my heart, ‘What is my Isaac? What is your Isaac that you’re willing to sacrifice? For Marvin, the answer was simple: **his martial arts trophies**.

God revealed **my pride and asked me to give them up**, so I packed them up in boxes, and I slowly walked them out to the curb.

However, surrendering his pride wasn’t easy. “I remember looking out my front window, seeing all the trophies on the curb, and begging God, ‘**Can I at least keep one?**’ But He said no, so that’s what I had to do. I had to let them go, and there was a **peace that overcame me afterward**.

God revealed to me through His Word that those trophies had taken up a large part in my heart and had turned into **an idol**, and He wanted me to **break the idols in my life**.



Marvin also said that giving up his idol has made it easier to surrender to God in other areas of his life: “We sacrifice every day in big and small moments, whether it be with church or work or family, but the Word of God has burrowed its way into my heart and **allowed me to surrender**.”

When we willingly lay down our “Isaacs,” God replaces pride with peace and leads us into deeper freedom and obedience.
