We give thanks that there is a river of witnesses that flows from Harriet Tubman to Josiah Henson, from Abraham Beverly Walker to Mary Ann Shadde and Mary Elizabeth Bibb, from Viola Davis Desmond to Willie O'Ree to the prophetic leaders who guide us today. Give us grace to follow them to freedom. Forgive us for where we have failed to understand, *Lord, in your mercy, set us free.*

Compassionate God, who sent Jesus Christ to deliver us from all manner of injustices and inequalities, create in us new hearts and enlarged visions, to see the image of God in every person irrespective of background, race and ethnicity.
