From The Pastor's Desk: Do Not Be Afraid - Again

Dear Friends,

In August 2019, I wrote "Do Not Be Afraid" for the UCC Mental Health Network. I saw a world where human dignity felt disposable amid violence and fear. I hoped we might learn, change, and turn toward justice.

Though years have passed, little has changed—so we return to these questions anew.

Today, cruelty is defended as policy. Fear is used for power. Some communities are told their lives matter less. Immigrants are scapegoated. LGBTQ+ people are targeted. Communities of color still suffer under unaccountable systems. None of this happens by accident. These are the results of choices, structures, and silence.

Scripture does not call us to be comfortable with this.

*"Do not be afraid, for I am with you;
do not be discouraged, for I am your God."
(Isaiah 41:10)*

These words are not meant to soothe us into complacency but to strengthen us for resistance.

Faith refuses to normalize harm to God's people. It does not mistake peace for quiet or unity for avoidance. Hope does not pretend things are better than they are. Hope insists injustice cannot define our future.

To say "do not be afraid" now is not to deny fear. It is to refuse to let fear decide who we love, protect, or ignore.

As we enter February, may our faith ground us. Let us be a congregation that tells the truth, stands with the vulnerable, and actively pursues justice and love in our daily lives. Reach out to support those who are suffering, speak out for those who are targeted, and, together, participate in acts of solidarity within our community.

While fear may shape the world, we can choose a greater power—faith, hope, and love. Let us be the people who meet fear with courage and justice, refusing to be formed by the world's anxiety, and instead shaping the world with God's vision for mercy and restoration.



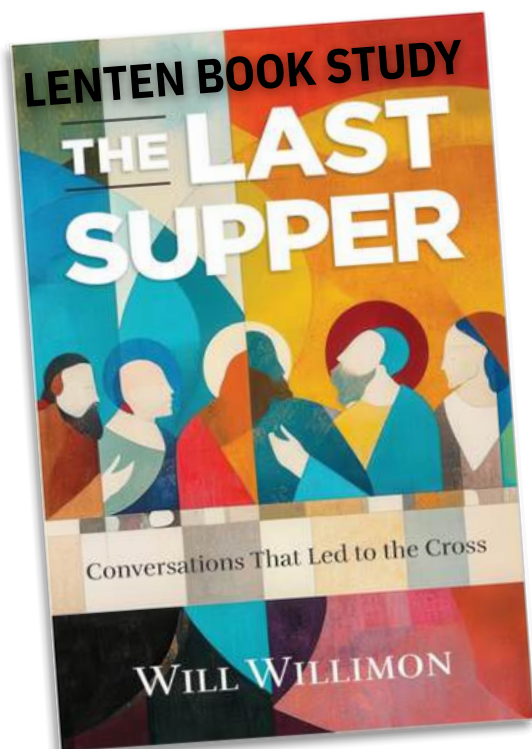

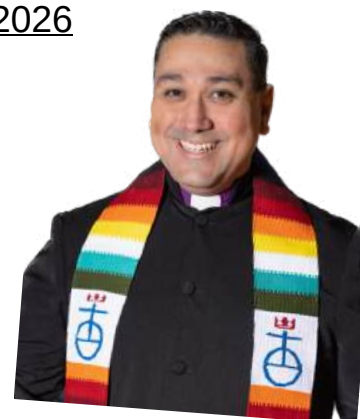

CHRIST CHURCH COUNCIL NOVEMBER 12, 2025 MEETING MINUTES

Call to Order: 7:00 pm

Roll Call: Judy Rosedale, Bob Neil, Mandy O'Donnell, Holly Schmidt, Laura Hallberg, Pastor Gilbert
Prayer

Review of October 8, 2025 Council Minutes:

Motion and second to approve the October 8, 2025 minutes as sent out.

The motion passed to accept the minutes.

Review of Financial Report: Not available due to transition.

Officer Reports – none

PASTOR'S REPORT –(OCTOBER 2- NOVEMBER 4)

Worship & Arts: Regular Worship services – 4 (four); 1 with communion; All Saints Day service

Faith Forward Commission | Christian Education:

- Led book discussion “Blood Brothers”
- Advent season 4-week book study of “Angels of Christmas”
- Wednesdays 11/19, 12/3, 12/17 and Monday 12/8

Pastoral Care: Pastoral contact (pastoral care-related calls/texts, emails, in-person visits, greeting cards) = 30+

Discretionary Fund

- Check to the Backpack Project for \$400 for hoodies for high schoolers.
- Check for \$1400 to a vendor to assist with home repairs for an individual in need

Administrative:

- Staff Meeting – Eight (8)
- Continue to co-manage all social media. Updated website
- Three (3) committee meeting(s).
- Bookkeeping services, included in the approved 2026 budget at \$8922, will now be handled externally.

Personnel:

- Our Finance Manager had his annual review in October.
- As part of the ongoing transitions, the Finance Manager will assume a new title and the hours have been adjusted to help offset the cost of outsourcing the bookkeeping.
- The Personnel Committee approved allowing our maintenance technician to advertise that he is available for handyman work.
- The Finance Committee and Personnel Chair approved the hiring of a Music Director beginning in mid-January at a rate of \$900 / month for the first 90 days and \$1000 / month thereafter. The position is scheduled for an average of five hours per week. Needs Church Council approval.
- Following the advice of our bookkeeper, all part-time employees are compensated at an hourly rate. The final job description will be submitted to the Personnel and Finance committees and then forwarded to the Church Council for final approval.

Wider UCC & DP Community Meetings/Presentations/Events:

- Clergy Alliance Meetings – two (2): Lunch meeting with one Alliance member
- El Salvador Delegation Prep Meeting
- Illinois Conference of the UCC Meetings – three (3): Illinois Conference of the UCC Annual Celebration; Presented the new Conference Governance Structure; Elected Board of Directors Secretary for a two-year term
- A motion was made and seconded and passed to accept the Pastor's report.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Building Committee: District 62 will utilize our parking lot during their construction.

Mission Committee: For Thanksgiving, we will be baking cupcakes for our sister church, San Lucas. They will be feeding the needy families in the Humboldt Park area. We ask our congregation to bring the dessert to their dinner table. Please make 2 dozen cupcakes and bring them to the Church kitchen on Sunday, Nov. 23 and they will be delivered on Monday, Nov. 24. In December we will have some children's names, from the area, and we will ask the congregation to pick a name or two, and purchase a gift or gift card for a child. More details will come later.

ONA Wise Committee: ONA has a meeting this month. We will look to refresh the committee and seek out additional members.

Outreach Committee:

- The Outreach Committee met on November 3rd to finalize plans for our upcoming November and December events.
- Welcoming the Stranger – On Sunday, November 9th, from 12:00–1:30 p.m., Exodus World Services will present "Welcoming the Stranger." This program, open to both the community and Christ Church members, explores ways to extend hospitality and support to newcomers and refugees.
- 4th Des Plaines Community Sing-Along – Join us on Friday, December 5th, at 7:00 p.m. for the annual Community Sing-Along. The Des Plaines Clergy Alliance and members of the wider community will come together to celebrate the holiday season with music, fellowship, and hospitality.
- Empty Bowls Event – On Saturday, December 6th, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., we will be highlighting the Empty Bowls event at Oakton College. This meaningful event raises funds to support local food banks and raise awareness about hunger in our community.
- The committee looks forward to an active and engaging season of outreach and community.

Unfinished Business

Music Director position - drafting a job description for final approval- will include practice and directing the choir. Will pay an hourly rate. Position to begin in mid-January. The motion passed.

New Business:

Motion to elect Judy Rosedale as Council President, Laura Hallberg as Vice President and Mandy O'Donnell as secretary. The motion passed. Installation will be December 7.

Bookkeeping Update: During the Annual Meeting, the congregation approved a modest budget to outsource the bookkeeping portion of our finances. The company taking on this work is Church Training Center, which previously conducted an audit of our finances and structure. This change is intended to strengthen our financial tracking and introduce additional checks and balances beyond our previous system.

Finance Role Update: With the shift to outsourced bookkeeping, the Finance Manager's title has been updated to reflect his new responsibilities within the revised structure. Moving forward, the position will be known as Finance Coordinator. As such, hours will also be adjusted to reflect the change in assigned tasks.
