## Pastor's Corner



### "Genuine Love"

*"Love is patient and kind; it is not jealous or conceited or proud; love is not ill-mannered or selfish or irritable; love does not keep a record of wrongs; love is not happy with evil, but is happy with the truth. Love never gives up; and its faith, hope, and patience never fail. Love is eternal."*  
*1 Corinthians 13:4-8a GNT*

This month (February) is considered the "love month". But for me, expressing love is not only for a specific month or day, but it is done every day.

1 Corinthians 13:4-8a is about the qualities of genuine love as described by the apostle Paul, emphasizing patience, kindness, humility, selflessness, forgiveness, perseverance, and the eternal nature of love. "Love in truth. Truth in love. Never one at the expense of the other. Never the embrace of love without the torch of truth. Never the heat of truth without the warmth of love. . ." (Max Lucado). "We know how much God loves us, and we have put our trust in his love. God is love, and all who live in love live in God, and God lives in them" (1 John 4:16 NLT).

The text from 1 Corinthians 13:4-5 beautifully encapsulates the essence of true love. It serves as a guiding light for how we should strive to love others. It challenges us to reflect on our own actions and attitudes in our relationships by outlining what love is not (envious, boastful, proud, rude, self-seeking, easily angered, holding onto grudges). This passage calls us to consider how we can embody the virtues of patience, kindness, and humility as we navigate our interactions with others. It prompts us to ask ourselves: Are my actions driven by selflessness and a desire to uplift others? Am I quick to anger, or do I strive to approach situations with patience, kindness, and understanding? Jesus said, "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another" (John 13:34-35 NIV).

We can cultivate love that is profound, authentic, and transformative by reflecting on these questions. Love ultimately serves as a poignant reminder of its power to heal, unite, and bring joy and peace to our lives as God's children. It challenges us to embody love in its purest form, encouraging us to approach our relationships with compassion, empathy, and forgiveness. Through applying the virtues in this chapter (1 Corinthians 13), we can nurture connections that are rooted in mutual respect, understanding, and genuine care for one another. God loves you, so do I (GLYSDI). **GOD BLESS EVERYONE!**

Programs/Speakers/Activities for each unit meeting will be promoted in our church newsletter and bulletins. We will continue to nurture each other and offer fellowship and education.


Our Sock Collection is discontinued but some Easy Saves are listed below and can be tossed into the Blue Tub in the Narthex:




## Church & Society

Americans generally are very compassionate and wonderful people but something doesn't seem right.

On one hand, we are told to love our neighbor- not only the one living next door, but everyone. We are to love them not only when things are going well, when we agree with each other, if we look alike or even if we worship together, but also if we disagree about certain matters.

We see speech and action seeming to disrespect and even showing hatred toward nations and groups of people. Something isn't right!

It's understandable due to its size, wealth and military might that the United States of America has great power and influence in our country and throughout the world. How should we use that power and influence? Should we use it by trying to respect and work with all people and nations or proceed from the standpoint of Might Makes Right?

Should we sit down with others to seek solutions and good will or should we blow them out of the water, take over countries, or threaten countries and people like Mexico, Colombia, Cuba, Canada, Greenland, Iran, or immigrants?

### ***Does our church have anything to say about it?***

South African Luminary Bishop Desmond Tutu once articulated; "the truth is we need each other. In our world, we can only survive and experience freedom together." 
