## A Word from the Pastors

*“Return to the Lord, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love.”*  
**Joel 2:13**

Lent begins February 18th! Many times we forget why things change so much in worship during the season of Lent. Therefore, we wanted to share this reminder of why we do what we do in worship during Lent.

Key worship changes during Lent:

**The color Purple.** (Because of Lent's penitential nature, worship tends to be more solemn, and this is the reason purple is the liturgical color of the season. Purple also represents the royalty of Jesus which is demonstrated most clearly as Jesus hangs on the throne of the cross.)

**There are no live altar flowers, we use dead wheaten chaff.** (We began lent with Ash Wednesday's “Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return”, which is why we do not use real flowers in worship.)

**The communion set is not the shiny gold chalice that we have become accustom to, but we switch to pottery vessels.** (Jesus was thought to have used simple pottery for the plate and chalice at the Last Supper.)

**The music is more reflective.** (Return to the Lord your God and the cross are central Lenten themes that are heard and sung in Lenten hymns and liturgy.)

**The Baptismal Font is at the entrance of the sanctuary instead of at the head of the aisle.** (In Lent, we constantly remember who and whose we are as we enter/exit the worship space.)

**We change to the alternate version of the Lord's Prayer called the Modern Version.** (The Lord's Prayer is Biblical. The modern Lord's Prayer comes from Matthew 6:7-13. It is with this passage that Jesus is teaching his disciples to pray. And in the same way even 2000 plus years later, Jesus continues to teach us to pray. “Pray then in this way: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And do not bring us to the time of trial, but rescue us from the evil one.” )

**Wooden Cross** (This is used to remind us of the instrument of our Salvation down on our level. This cross is used throughout Lent through Good Friday. On Easter it becomes the Easter cross with fresh flowers reminding us that from death comes life because of Jesus.)

**Carpenter Nail** (We carry these nails with us for the 40 day journey of Lent. We use these nails for the Good Friday service as we nail them to the cross remembering Jesus taking on our sin.)

**Changes in liturgy** (There is no Hymn of Praise, Return to the Lord is sung for the Gospel Acclamation, Create in Me is used for post offering canticle, Now Lord you let your servant go in peace is used post communion and of course the modern Lord's prayer is used. All these changes are made to reflect the season and our journey with Jesus to the cross.)

We hope these changes will help you on your Lenten journey. During Lent we find ourselves changed guided to the cross leading to Holy Week. May you keep a Holy Lent.

### Our Allen Organ Got a Glow-Up!

Big news, Advent family! Our beloved 1984 Allen organ has just received some major TLC, and let me tell you...

she is *singing* again!   

This past week, the amazing **Jim Ingram of AO Services, Inc.** visited Advent to put the finishing touches on our organ's rejuvenation. He replaced the completely worn-down felt on the Great manual *and* took the entire pedalboard on a little road trip to Lexington, SC for a full rebuild. (We like to think it enjoyed its spa retreat.)

On Thursday, Jim came back to reunite everything, met with Pastor Jason, and made sure the whole instrument was in tip-top shape. The result? Our organ now plays like it's 1984 again—in the *best* way. 

Back in December, Jim also gave the organ a full revoicing session. Some stops had been adjusted over the years and weren't sounding as balanced or bright as they should. During the process, we even discovered a couple of unplugged speakers—oops! But once everything was reconnected and all the stops and speakers were balanced, the transformation was incredible.

To top it off, when Jim refelted the Great manual, he removed *every single* key. And R.J. added a brand-new rug under the organ to keep the bench steady and make the loft extra cozy for our musicians. (Comfort + stability = the dream.)

Now, let's be real: every instrument of this age needs a little maintenance here and there. It's totally normal. And thanks to the work done this year, our Allen organ is ready to keep going strong for *another 40 years*. That's right—don't let her age fool you! This thing is built like a tank and sounds like a dream.


We owe so much gratitude to the wonderful folks who sacrificed and invested in this instrument back in 1984. Their vision was spot-on—it was an excellent decision then, and it continues to bless our church today in powerful and beautiful ways.

And a special shout-out to **Ryan Booth**, who helped Jim back in December by climbing into all those speaker chambers and making adjustments. (Every superhero doesn't wear a cape—some carry Allen Organ screwdrivers.)



## **2026 Lenten Theme for Sunday Worship: Dying His Death, Living His Life**

In Lent, we are reminded of our Baptism and how we are buried with Christ in his death so that we might live with him in his resurrection. The old is gone. The new has come. Each day affords us a chance to die to self and live for Jesus. In word and song in these worship services for the holy season, contemplate those things that were put to death on the cross so that we might receive the blessings of new life in Christ.

### **Feb. 18—Ash Wednesday • Dying to Sin, Living in Forgiveness**

We lay our sins on Jesus and receive his forgiveness in return.

### **Sun., Feb. 22—Week 1 • Dying to Pride, Living for Others**

We turn away from self to turn to others in love.

### **Sun., Mar. 1—Week 2 • Dying to Greed, Living for the Treasures of Heaven**

We release our grip on earthly things that we might grasp those things above.

### **Sun, Mar. 8—Week 3 • Dying to Doubt, Living by Faith**

We rid ourselves of uncertainty in exchange for total trust in Christ.

### **Sun., Mar. 15—Week 4 • Dying to Turmoil, Living in Peace**

We trade our troubles for the comfort of Christ.

### **Sun., Mar. 22—Week 5 • Dying to Judgment, Living in Grace**

We are released from punishment to dwell in Christ's mercy.

## SHROVE TUESDAY/MARDI GRAS PANCAKE DINNER

Mardi Gras is French for "Fat Tuesday", reflecting the practice of the last night of eating richer, fatty foods before the ritual fasting of the Lenten season which begins on Ash Wednesday. Shrove Tuesday is another name for this event. Shrove derives from the word shrive which means absolve. Eating of richer foods like pancakes empties our cupboards of temptations while reminding us of the fasting to come in Lent. We will have a time to eat and fellowship with activities followed by the burying of the Alleluia to end the evening as we look to Lent.

## WEDNESDAY LENTEN DINNER WORSHIP

This year for Lent, we will gather for **Dinner Worship at 6:30pm** in the Fellowship Hall. Our first Lenten Dinner Worship will be **February 25th**. We will continue this tradition for the 5 Wednesdays in Lent.

During these midweek dinner worship times, we will reflect on the Lenten theme, Dying His Death, Living His Life. Each day affords us a chance to die to self and live for Christ.

Lenten Dinner Worship days will be: February 25, March 4, 11, 18, & 25. We will eat and worship together in the Fellowship Hall. There will be a signup at Sign-Up Central for those that would like to help by bringing soup or sandwiches for these events. We pray you will join us for these midweek services in Lent.



## **January Advent Hurricane Relief Update:**

Since the September 2024 Hurricane Helene in our immediate area our Congregation has joined forces with Pastor Scott Parrish with our Methodist friends at UMCOR.

Davin Henrik is the new Director for Disaster Ministry for the ELCA. He is excited about his new position. His wife is a Lutheran Pastor, and they have two young children.

We immediately began housing and feeding volunteer relief workers that are so badly needed in our area. To date we have housed **40** volunteer groups at Advent. They have completed **14078** hours of work in our community.

There are currently approximately 150 houses that are on the list for repairs and many more applications. There are currently 70 long-term (until April) volunteers from the Mennonite and Amish communities in town working at 7 different locations each day.


