#### NEW QR CODE

## Our Call to Humility in A Time of Sacred Beginning

Spring is before us and thus a sacred beginning. Beginnings and new life are ever before us as children of creation. To think that we all start out with-in the circle of a sacred beginning, a call of the Creator, (Isaiah 6:8)! How we respond in that moment determines our personal journey. But too often in the journey of life and faith, we place ourselves too highly on the scale of importance, thinking that it is for us to change the world and to correct and call out injustices. Humility teaches us that we should never elevate ourselves and that we should instead do our small part which, combined with the efforts of others in our community, helps make up a greater whole. No one we look up to and admire got there by themselves; instead, they walked with and behind a greater host and community of leaders before them. None became famous without the approval of others. Our humble beginnings and call all need to be remembered in humility. None of us human beings are perfect; we all have failed and offended. And yet Christ came to be one with us—he lived, died and rose again for us that we might have a new and sacred beginning with our Creator God.
