
DID YOU KNOW?

St. Peter's is part of the Anglican Diocese of Islands and Inlets which consists of 45 parishes! Have you ever wondered what the other churches in this Diocese are like? Perhaps you've gone to one or two of them when you're visiting family "up island" or gone to a special service in Victoria? As an ongoing long-term project, I will try and shed a little light on as many of the 45 parishes as possible starting with.... **St. Columba's Anglican United Church in Port Hardy!**



St Columba's Anglican United Church developed during the early 1970's in a period when the United and Anglican Churches in Canada were exploring closer ties. The building was originally built during World War II near the airport as a recreation hall and served a variety of purposes until it was purchased by the congregation and moved by truck and barge to its current location. The shared ministry agreement of a rotating fixed 4-year term has been amended to allow more flexibility in calling ministers but the tradition of alternating

between Anglican and United ministers has generally continued. Rev. Christine Muise, an Anglican priest is currently the minister. Services are held every Sunday at 10:30 a.m. followed by a free drop in lunch at 11:45 a.m. They also host a Loaves and Fishes bi-weekly food bank pick-up which includes the ability to choose the food from what is on offer.



The image to the right was created by parishioner Robert Fyles and signifies:

- The cedar tree was truly a tree of life for the First Nations who have shared their land with us.
- The tree grows out of a rock, just as our faith is founded on the rock of Our Savior's love.
- The arch way rises out of the water as we rise from the waters of baptism into new life.
