REFUGEE SUNDAY AT ST. PETER'S on JUNE 23



Refugee Sunday is an opportunity to affirm what we believe and who we are. It is an opportunity to learn about and lift up in prayer, those who carry out these ministries, and to learn about and lift up in prayer, all those who have been forced to flee their homes, either as internally displaced people (IDPs) in their country of origin or as refugees in neighbouring or distant lands. It is an opportunity to affirm the many gifts we receive when we welcome the stranger: gifts of friendship, of insights, of skills, knowledge, and wisdom that refugees bring to share with us. And it is an opportunity for us together, to be transformed.

At St Peter's, we will pray for refugees and have a short announcement about the topic that day. **Following the services, Subhia will be selling a selection of Syrian foods and Artist Nan Goodship will be selling her art cards.** Proceeds from these two ventures will go towards helping Subhia's brother and his family who are trying to leave their dire situation in the Democratic Republic of Congo.

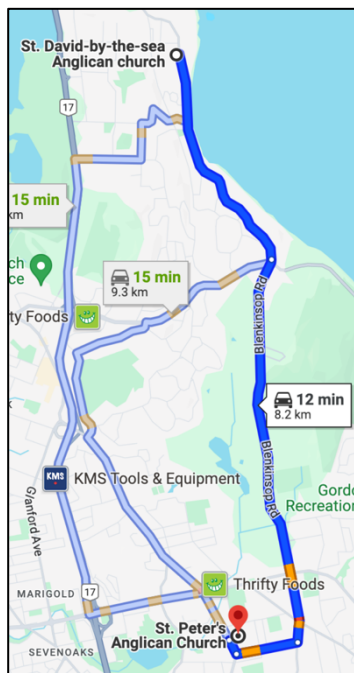

DID YOU KNOW?

St. Peter, Quamichan is part of the Anglican Diocese of Islands and Inlets which consists of 45 parishes! As an ongoing long-term project, I will try and shed a little light on as many of these parishes as possible. This week we will look at the **TWO SAINTS MINISTRY** in Saanich: **St. David-by-the-Sea, Cordova Bay, and St. Peter, Lakehill.**



The spirit of St. David by-the-Sea has been a part of Cordova Bay and its community since 1944. That year, a group of Anglican women first began regularly meeting at the home of one of the parish's future members. These friendships grew to include a Sunday school, and the first one, in 1946, included 22 children. That same year, the Women's Guild raised \$600 to buy land for the future parish from Cordova Bay resident Mr. Sutcliffe. The parish hall's cornerstone was laid May 29, 1947. The parish then worshipped in the hall for the next twenty-eight years. It wasn't until November 30, 1979, that the St. David's congregation finally achieved its full dream, dedicating the building that exists today.

St. Peter's Lakehill began as a mission of St. Luke's parish, Cedar Hill, in the mid-1940s. For the first half century, parishioners of St. Peter's worshipped in two converted army barracks, previously located on their present site. In 1998, the parish finally achieved its dream of a purpose-built sanctuary and parish hall, which continues to be used to this day.

In 2012, these two congregations came together to form **The Two Saints Ministry**. A shared priest, a united council and a long list of shared activities in worship, social gatherings and the community has produced a vital and vibrant church family.
