Conviction or Invitation

3 Practical Factors to consider:

**1) Desire**

Psalms 73:25 (NLT) - “..I desire you more than anything on earth.”

**2) Determination**

Mark 5:25-28 (NLT) - 8 For she thought to herself, “If I can just touch his robe, I will be healed.”

**3) Destiny**

John 6:67-68 (NLT) - “Lord, to whom would we go? You have the words that give eternal life.

Jeremiah 17:8 (NLT) - They are like trees planted along a riverbank,  
with roots that reach deep into the water.  
Such trees are not bothered by the heat  
or worried by long months of drought.  
Their leaves stay green,  
and they never stop producing fruit.

2. What might be some of the roadblocks that could hinder our partnerships with God? (It might be helpful to identify those roadblocks as either self-imposed or imposed by outside sources.)

3. What are some of the things that you have done in the past to better understand your partnership with the Lord? What types of practical steps have you taken to grow in your friendship with God?
