



Quiet Time Questions from 11/23/25

Begin your quiet time each day with prayer. Ask the LORD to help you focus and understand what you are studying.

MAIN POINT OF THIS WEEK'S PASSAGE: Despite our dysfunction, God overturns human plans to fulfill His plan of salvation.

MEMORY VERSE FOR THE WEEK: *"But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8)*

1. Read Genesis 27. How does the dysfunction in Isaac's family (rebellion, spiritual blindness, and deception) mirror patterns we sometimes see in our own families, especially during seasons like Thanksgiving? In what ways might each person in the story have contributed to the family's brokenness? Where do you see yourself in their actions?

2. Read Genesis 27. This week's message emphasized how God's covenant blessing continues despite human sin and foolishness. How does Genesis 27 encourage us to trust God's sovereignty even when circumstances, or people, seem to be working against His plan? Where in your life do you need to trust that God's purposes will prevail even through imperfect people or messy situations?

3. Genesis 27 shows that God chooses the unlikely and undeserving (Jacob the deceiver, not Esau the firstborn). How does this reversal point us to the Gospel, and how should it shape our view of God's grace toward us? In what ways do we sometimes feel like "second sons" who don't deserve blessing, and how does the Gospel speak to that?
