



## Quiet Time Questions from 11/16/25

Begin your quiet time each day with prayer. Ask the LORD to help you focus and understand what you are studying.

**MAIN POINT OF THIS WEEK'S PASSAGE:** God will supply all of our needs for His glory, for our good, and according to His plan.

**MEMORY VERSE FOR THE WEEK:** *"And my God shall supply all of our needs according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:19)*

1. **Read Genesis 26:12-32.** Isaac becomes extremely wealthy and faces repeated conflict. How does this combination help us correct imbalanced views of God's provision? How should this shape the way we interpret our own seasons of abundance or struggle? How does Isaac's experience in Genesis 26 challenge both prosperity-focused and suffering-focused understandings of God's blessing?
2. **Read Genesis 26:12-32.** Is obedience always confrontational? Is it always peaceful? How do we know when to stand firm and when to step back? Discuss how God may call different believers to different responses while still working out His purpose. Isaac responds to conflict differently than Abraham did—Abraham confronted, Isaac yielded. What does this teach us about discerning God's will in moments of tension or opposition?
3. **Read Genesis 26:12-32.** According to Genesis 26:23–25, Isaac's confidence in God's provision came from God's Word. How does this passage illustrate the role of Scripture and spiritual community in discerning God's will today? Why is it dangerous to interpret life's circumstances apart from God's Word? How does studying Scripture with other believers keep us accountable and help us better understand God's provision?
