



## Sermon Notes: "The Unqualified"

Matthew 9:35 - 10:4; 2 Corinthians 4:5-7; 1 Corinthians 1:27-29

### **THE NEED WAS OVERWHELMING:**

- **Matthew 9:35-38:** Jesus went everywhere did everything and felt deeply but what did he find: the crowds weren't just large they were lost.
- The harvest is opportunity, not burden.
- **Implication of Prayer:** When you ask God to send workers, don't be surprised when He taps your shoulder.

### **THE UNLIKELY LINE UP:**

- Jesus builds teams the world would never draft.
- Jesus gave them authority — not because of who they were, but because of who HE is.

**Big TAKEAWAY:** God's design is partnership, not performance.

### **LESSONS FROM JUDAS:**

- Grace and sovereignty work together.
- **Warning:** Proximity isn't the same as surrender.

The harvest is still plentiful. The workers are still few. And Jesus is still calling.

## For Study, Reflection, Discussion During the Week:

**Life Group ICEBREAKER:** Have you ever been picked for something you felt completely unqualified for? What happened?

### REVIEW:

Review the sermon notes from Sunday. Was there a particular point that stuck with you? What was it and why did it resonate with you?

### READ: Matthew 9:35-38

- Jesus saw the crowds as "harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd." Where do you see people like this in your daily life — at work, in your neighborhood, online?
- Darin said, "The harvest is opportunity, not burden." How does this shift your perspective on sharing your faith or serving others?

### READ: Matthew 10:1-4

- Look at the list of the Twelve. Which disciple do you most relate to and why? (Peter the loud mouth? Thomas the doubter? Matthew the outsider?) Jesus put a tax collector (Matthew) and a zealot (Simon) on the same team — political enemies! What does this tell us about the kind of community Jesus builds?
- "Jesus gave them authority — not because of who THEY were, but because of who HE is." How does this truth free you from the pressure to be "good enough" for God to use you?
- Jesus chose Judas KNOWING he would betray Him. What does this tell us about grace? What does it tell us about God's sovereignty?

### READ: 1 Corinthians 1:27-29

- God chose the "foolish," "weak," "lowly," and "despised" things — why? What's the purpose according to verse 29?
- What area of your life do you feel most "unqualified" — at work, in parenting, in ministry, in your faith? How does this passage speak to that?

**DEPLOY: This Week Pray the Dangerous Prayer** — Ask God: "Lord of the harvest, send out workers... and show me where YOU want to send ME." Be ready for Him to answer because God's design is *partnership*, not *performance*. What's the difference between being CLOSE to Jesus and being SURRENDERED to Jesus? How do you know which one you are?
