Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. – Matthew 7:7

Have you ever been to confirmation class? If your answer is yes, then you probably know that confirmation is an opportunity for youth and adults to affirm their baptisms and confirm their faith as Lutherans. When we celebrated Jesus' baptism in January, I preached about our tradition of baptizing infants and adults, welcoming people of any age into the family of God.

It is typical for people who are baptized as infants and raised as Lutherans to take the next faithful step of learning more about who God is, who we are, what scripture says, and what our traditions are built on. Confirmation class is often for middle schoolers, who spend a couple of years studying with their pastor, learning all kinds of stuff and asking all kinds of questions and eating all kinds of snacks.

But maybe it has been a while since you were in middle school. Or maybe you were not raised Lutheran or in any kind of tradition that included confirmation. Either way, you have questions. I know you do, because you ask them all the time! And some of you ask me similar questions, and I bet some of you have those same questions but just haven't ever asked. So we're going to dig in.

During the season of Lent, we'll begin a series called Things You Missed in Confirmation Class. During the after-worship Community Time on February 22 and March 15, we'll gather in Luther Hall to address some of the things you are the most curious about. I have some ideas, but I also want to tell you about things you want to know. So there will be a question box available on Sunday mornings between now and then for you to scribble your questions to me. You can also email or text me your questions. They can be about anything.

A classic confirmation curriculum contains sessions about the Old Testament, the New Testament, Jesus, liturgy and worship, other Christian traditions and other religions, Martin Luther and the Protestant Reformation, our Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, and discipleship—how we apply our faith in daily life.

Your questions can be general: what do Lutherans believe about prayer? Or they can be specific: what translation of the bible do we use? Maybe there's a character in the Old Testament that you've always wanted to learn more about. Or maybe you don't even know what you don't know, and you want to hear about some of the unsung heroes of our scripture. If you're curious about the new Presiding Bishop of the ELCA, or what a Presiding Bishop even is, ask away.

Submitting your questions in advance will help me group them together into similar sections and prepare thorough answers. I have these two sessions on the calendar, but we'll keep going beyond that based on your questions.

If you are a recent visitor to SMLC, grew up Catholic, have been Lutheran all your life, or anything in between, your questions are welcome. There is absolutely no shame in not knowing something you think you should have learned before. Your curiosity is holy, and it is a gift to me to help you feel more comfortable and confident in your life as a follower of Jesus.

There will not be a test, and when all else fails, the answer is "God loves you."

Council Update

Hello SMLC! Here are the updates for the January Council meeting.

The Council met on January 21 for our regular monthly meeting. The Council accepted and/or approved the submitted minutes and reports as well as reports for December. The Council considered 4 items of business. First, the Council approved the 2026 Budget recommended by the Budget committee and forwarded to the congregation for approval at the February 8th Congregational Meeting. The Council approved the email use policy for all users of email addresses with the domain @sanmarcoslutheran.org. The Council approved the Endowment committee recommendations for the disbursement of income from 2025. Lastly the Council established a Finance committee to advise and make recommendations on items requiring greater input than the Treasurer and bookkeeper alone. As part of the Finance committee approval, the standing members of the committee were established.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve as president for 2026 and for your continued support of SMLC, our Council, Pastor Casey, and the staff.

ALL SAINTS FOOD PANTRY



