



What We Believe

We believe homeschooling is a sacred partnership between families, educators, and God, and that education is about the formation of the whole person, mind, heart, and character.

1. We Believe God Is the Source of All Truth

8. We Believe in Emotional Growth and Healthy Relationships

We believe children should be taught to understand emotions, resolve conflict biblically, communicate with grace, and build healthy relationships with peers and adults (Ephesians 4:2–3; Romans 12:18).

9. We Believe in Community and Mutual Support

We believe families grow best in Christ-centered community. Our co-op is a place of encouragement, accountability, prayer, and shared responsibility (Hebrews 10:24–25).
