May God's grace give us the necessary joy, peace, and patience to love our neighbors.



Ash Wednesday is February 18, 2026. It is the start of the Lenten Season. During Lent, we fast, attend small groups, and participate in special worship services to contemplate the life, death, and resurrection of our Savior & Lord, Jesus. So, in the spirit of Lent, I am starting a five-part Beacon article series on the 'Theories of Atonement'.

All Christians believe that the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus saves us from our sins and reconciles us to God. However, there are many explanations as to **how** the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus does this. These explanations are called 'theories of atonement'. I will introduce you to five common theories. Here is the schedule: February (This issue) – A chart briefly explaining the five theories, March - Ransom theory, April - Christ as Victor theory, May - Satisfaction/penal substitution theory, June – Recapitulation/Divinization theory, and July – Moral example/Scapegoat theory.

As you contemplate these theories of atonement, remember that there is no 'correct' theory. They all have their strengths and weaknesses. You are free to choose which theories or parts of theories make the most sense to you. Exactly how the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus atones for our sins is a mystery. Just trust the mystery and know that God saves us by grace through faith in Jesus.

Recapitulation/Divination Theory	Jesus lived the perfect life and became the new Adam – the new man. Jesus reversed the course of humankind from disobedience to obedience. Moral example/scapegoat theory	Jesus gave us the supreme moral example of love & justice. This example inevitably led Him to the cross. Jesus’ death was an example of how sinful humanity enacts violence on innocent people because we blame them for our troubles (Scapegoating). The resurrection repudiates this behavior. 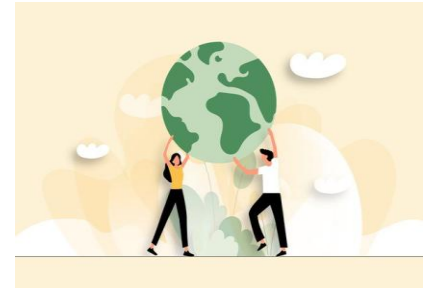


Green Team Book Review

God's Kitchen/Food Pantry

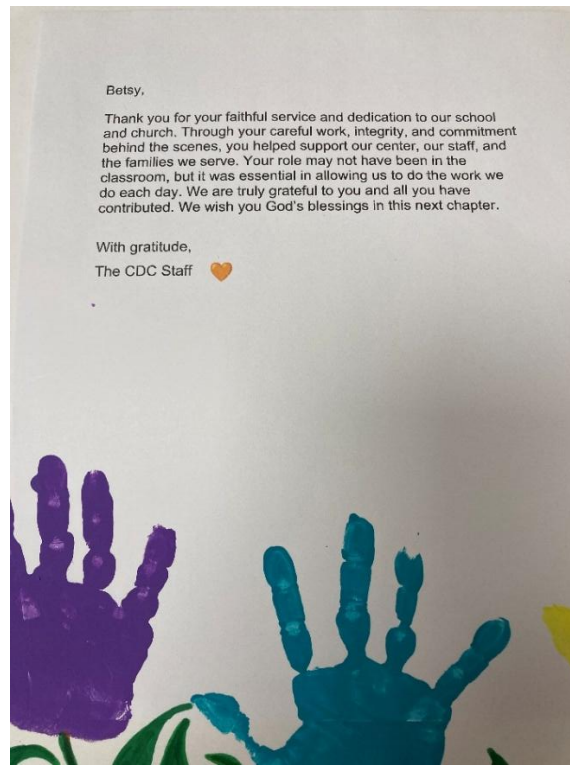

Starting Monday, February 2, 2026 at 6:30 PM in Joy Classroom. We will study the Bible passages upon which the previous show of the Chosen were based.

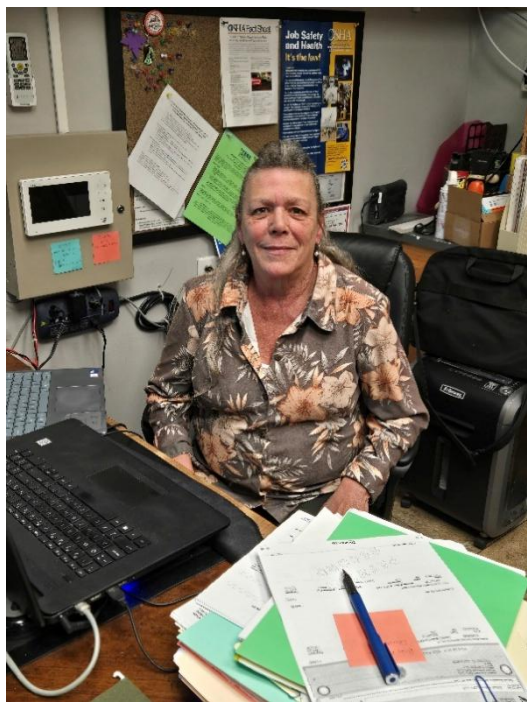


Prayer Shawl Ministry

Notes/Commentaries from the Wesley Study Bible

Wesley Core Term: Ethics

(Wesley Study Bible, Page 1140, Amos 5:16-6:1)

Engraved on the fountain outside of the Civil Rights Memorial in Montgomery Alabama, is Martin Luther King Jr.'s paraphrase of Amos 5:24: "Until justice rolls down like waters and righteousness like a mighty stream." King, like Amos before him, reminded believers that faithfulness requires more than beautiful worship and fervent prayer. A faithful life is a just and righteous life. John Wesley was known for his rigorous schedule of prayer, Scripture reading, and worship. But for Wesley, when someone was in need, helping that person took priority over prayer and other works of piety. Wesley wrote that a Christian, however zealous for works of piety, should be more zealous for works of mercy. "Whenever, therefore, one interferes with the other, works of mercy are to be preferred [over works of piety]. Even reading [Scripture], hearing [the Gospel], prayer, are to be omitted, or to be postponed, 'at charity's almighty call' – when we are called to relieve the distress of our neighbor, whether in body or soul" (Sermon 92: "On Zeal" Section II.9)
