Grosseto Church ministry update

Bible Institute—The Mighty Men program, we began in February, has developed into an opportunity to start Bible institute work. The Instituto Biblico is the only Baptist Bible institute in the country. It is based on Crown College's Evening School of the Bible. Five church plants around the country are collaborating with over 50 students enrolled. We just completed our first semester with Old Testament Survey part 1, and will resume in January with Old Testament Survey part 2. Each of the missionaries teaches a class on a rotation. I recently taught Genesis and 1 & 2 Samuel. The plan is to build the curriculum into a thorough ministry school for training nationals in the Word of God and the Work of the Lord. Please pray God will grow our students and call many of them to serve Him full-time in Italy.

College Campus recruitment—In October, we travelled to three college campuses (Maranatha Baptist University, Ambassador Baptist College, and Pensacola Christian College), preaching in chapel or missions prayer band, and interacting with hundreds of students. This was an exciting chance to expose young people to the great opportunity that exists for missions work around the world. Several students are lined up for an internship with us in Italy for the summers of 2026 and 2027. Plans were also laid out for hosting three mission trips from two different colleges during the months of May and June, 2026. Please pray the Lord would use these trips to touch the hearts of many to come serve Him in Italy.

Christmas Evangelistic Meeting—This year, we hosted our 15th annual evangelistic meeting the first week of December. It was such a pleasure to see folks who were saved in that very first meeting in 2010, serving the Lord 15 years later. We packed out our auditorium with nearly 100 people on the last evening of the meeting. A few of the people for whose salvation we are praying were able to come and hear the Gospel by way of the children's Christmas musical program and the preaching of evangelist Paul Crow. Please continue to pray for the salvation of Federico, Elisa, Franca, Amelia, Roger, Rosa, Alessio, and many others. It was a joy to see our faithful members inviting, praying, and bringing many visitors to hear the preaching.

Baptist World Mission Field Visits—In our role as field administrator for BWM, we recently made our second field visit to a missionary in a difficult field. It is our privilege to serve alongside men and women who are willing to give their lives to share the Gospel even in dangerous and challenging fields!

Family—Thank you for praying for our children! Arianna is much better since her blood infections in August. Please continue to pray for her healing. Our constant prayer is that our children will each love and serve God with their whole heart.

From the Heart of a Pastor - "Keeping the Pathway Clear"



As most people are aware, we don't get much snow in the South. So, when it does occur, it is a treat. It also affords many of us with an opportunity to engage in a number of events that are outside our normal, routine, sometimes monotonous undertakings. For the young, and the young at heart, sledding, snowball fights, and snowman building take center stage. Before long even others partake in the creation of snow angels and consuming snow cream.

But for many, there is the concern over whether or not they can safely make it from their front door to the driveway and subsequently to the highway. After all, life does go on even in the midst of bad weather. Furthermore, it provides yet another chance to learn important life lessons and how they apply to the Christian walk.

The recent winter storm that deposited several inches of beautiful snow taught me another one of those timeless truths. As I saw the need to clear a safe path from the front porch to the parking lot, I saw a most fascinating sight. The position of the parsonage in relation to the walkway was, and is, most intriguing. During the winter months, the sun shines on only a portion of the path. The rest of it resides in the shadows. This became even more apparent upon the completion of my post snow storm project. Part of the walk was now clear, clean, and safe upon which to tread. However, an equal amount was still icy and treacherous due to a number of factors.

All of this caused me to see that there were indeed a number of items that could greatly benefit the need of making and keeping the pathway clear. Proper tools and equipment go a long way in helping remove what has fallen. The use of ice melt (salt) and the blessing of both light and warmth can never be overstated. And yes, the more people that are involved in the task at hand makes the time go by faster and the work not nearly as exhausting. I trust that you are beginning to see some important parallels.

Within many of our homes, churches, and our nation, much has fallen and fallen away. Similar to the snow that was beautiful at first and then dangerous later on, precarious positions on a number of issues have been warmly embraced initially only to ultimately be revealed as deadly to all impacted. Without getting into much detail about the destructive nature of what has fallen, let me turn our attention to how we respond to them. When we do not approach the problems and perils of our age from the viewpoint that we need to enact change, we endanger the safety and security of not only ourselves but also all of those that come after us.

The sight of the walkway at the parsonage half in the light and half in the shadows hit me squarely between the eyes and penetrated deep into my heart. We ill afford to let the way our homes are constructed, or the way our churches have operated, adversely affect those within them or those that would visit them. And I am not talking about the dangers of snow and ice. When we conduct matters in a shady manner; when we do not walk in the light as we should; when our path is not illuminated with the brightness of His presence; when our way, and our words, is not seasoned with salt; when we do not let our walk be warm and welcoming, we are endangering more than we may ever comprehend and we greatly hinder the growth of all.

Since salt and light do indeed make a difference in melting an icy heart, may we all make a renewed commitment to being these much-needed items as Christ has called us to be and do. As much as I do not want someone to become physically injured because of my failure to Keep the Pathway Clear, oh how much more I am burdened and convicted by the prospect that others could fall into eternity, not ready to meet a holy God, because I have not Kept the Pathway Clear.

How about you?
