From the Pastor

Dear Friends;

Happy New Year! As we enter 2026, there are some things I wish to let you know about what goals we, as a congregation, will be working on for the new year. These goals were passed by those Grace members who attended the Charge Conference this past Autumn.

1. We will be updating the document that was approved by the Administrative Board during the time Fred Darbonne as here as pastor. This document lays out clearly the rolls and purposes of our administrative and ministry committees and boards for the work of the church. It will be a vital tool for us to be able to be clear in future directions and to be more effective in what those work areas do.
2. We will be working on hospitality skills for us as we move into the new year. We live in an era where more and more people distrust organized religion and more and more are feeling the need and seeking spiritual food for life. I believe Grace United Methodist Church is a place where we can meet people where they are.
3. We will begin discussing how we, as a congregation and as individual members, can prepare ourselves to better handle conflict by being able to have difficult conversations with each other. Like most lowans, we are uncomfortable with disagreements and conflict. This is not productive, and can be ultimately destructive. Disagreement does not mean separation or shunning. It means we all think, and think differently, which is neither shameful nor a crime. And we love through it all.

You'll hear more about these things as the year progresses. So let me close with these words of Howard Thurman on "The Work of Christmas."

"When the song of the angels is silent, when the star in the sky is gone, when the kings and princes have gone home, when the shepherds are back with their flock, the work of Christmas begins: to find the lost, to heal the broken, to feed the hungry, to release the prisoner, to rebuild the nations, to bring peace among others, to make music in the heart. Amen."

Winter Weather Guidelines




Christmas Eve
