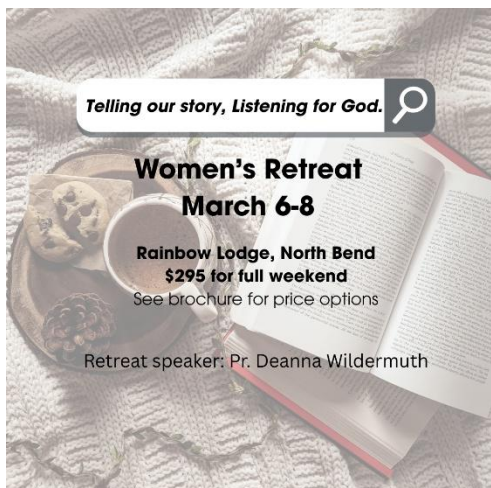

Membership Review

Periodically, it is customary to review the roll and make sure it's current. It has been four years since this was last done. Per section C8.05.01 of our Constitution, when a member has failed to receive Holy Communion and make a contribution of record for two consecutive calendar years, they may be removed from the membership roll. When a congregation member dies or transfers their membership to another congregation, they are automatically removed from the roll.

The process for determining which person(s) or families may need to be removed from membership, in accordance with the above guidelines, is as follows:

1. Initial review by Office Administrator and Pastor – *complete*
2. Review of list by the entire staff – *in process*
3. Review of list by the Council – *will happen at March meeting*
4. A letter is sent to the person or family advising them that they may be removed from the membership roll, and asking them to let us know of their intent by a certain date – *letter will be sent after Council review is complete*
5. After the deadline has passed, the Council will review the list again to approve the names of the members that will be removed from the roll – *will likely happen at the May Council meeting*

If a person or family is removed from our membership roll, it does not mean that they are cut off from the congregation. We will continue to provide care for them if/as it is requested. If you have questions about this process, please contact Kathy or Pastor Lara.

Saint Andrew's is participating in a national effort to help those SM who are hungry. It is called "SOUPER Bowl of Caring" and is held in connection with the Super Bowl. On February 8th – Super Bowl Sunday, we will be having a special collection to address hunger in our neighborhoods.

Hunger is everywhere in our community, from the suburbs on the Eastside to South King County to the streets of Downtown Seattle. It affects everyone: working families, the elderly, young adults and especially children. One in eight children in Washington State face hunger.

As we get excited about the big game on February 8th let's make an extra effort to fight hunger. Before and after the service that day, members of our church will be in the narthex collecting food and donations for this effort.

The key items being collected are:

- **Canned Hearty Soup (It IS the SOUPER Bowl!)**
- **Canned Chili and other meals: (Spaghetti-O's, Ravioli. Pork and Beans, Beef Stew, etc.)**
- **Canned Fruit (~ 15 ounce, preferably NOT in heavy syrup)**
- **Jars of Pasta Sauce (~24 ounces)**
- **Boxes of cereal (especially name brands)**
- **Ramen, Cup of Noodles, Noodle Kits, etc.**

The latest news from Compass Housing Alliance:

It's official! Compass Housing Alliance and Lutheran Community Services Northwest complete merger.

After years of affiliation and partnership, Compass Housing Alliance and Lutheran Community Services Northwest (LCSNW) are finally joining together as one organization! Their shared values: compassion, love, health, justice, and hope, make this joining together a win-win for the larger community. They have been consciously moving towards this goal for years.

This partnership has been growing closer over the past seven years and as of January 1st, their legal merger has been completed. Compass is now a division of LCSNW and will proudly continue doing the work they have for the past 105 years: affordable housing, emergency services, and enhanced emergency shelters for the larger community. By combining LCSNW's network of health and human services and Compass's expertise in affordable housing and emergency services, they provide holistic support to the communities they serve.

Some Background on Compass Housing Alliance:

Compass serves the community with LOVE, just like their founders, the Reverend Otto and Alva Karlstrom, intended more than 105 years ago. For more than a century, Compass Housing Alliance has provided neighbors in our community with support for housing, shelter, and essential emergency needs. With more than 20 sites spanning from Shoreline to Auburn, they have been a constant source of stability for people experiencing homelessness and housing insecurity through world wars, the Great Depression, the Civil Rights movement, and the rapid societal changes of the last two generations. Through every era, in partnership with thousands of supporters, they have adapted and evolved while holding fast to our core values of dignity, respect, and compassionate service.

Compass has Lutheran roots and continues to host a Lutheran congregation, the Church of Steadfast Love, at its main shelter building in Pioneer Square. However, Compass does not require or promote participation in any religious activity as part of its programs. Our synod assembly in May approved a resolution supporting Global Refuge's innovative *Camino de Casa* project. Featuring Andrew Steele from Global Refuge, this hybrid event documents the journeys of unaccompanied minors who have been deported and returned to their country of origin. It highlights how Global Refuge helps them re-enter their communities and be reunited with families, providing mental and physical health screening, job training, and other support that will ensure they have greater success in coming home to stay. Participants will watch a short documentary featuring personal stories of youth and the impact of US immigration policies; and in real time, will ZOOM with

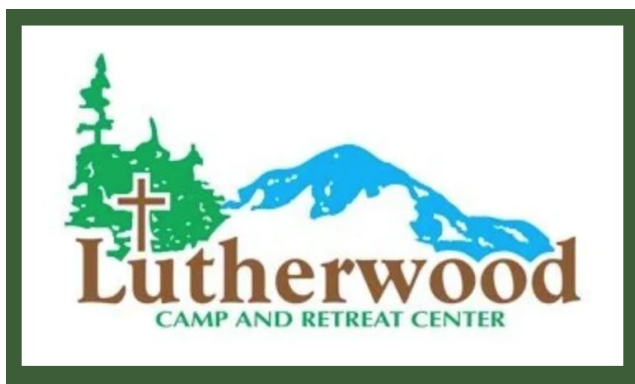
