Vicar's Voice

"**Boldly we approach...**"

Hi Everyone,

"***You are CHEEKY bold!***" These are the words of my Grade 6 teacher to one of my classmates. She was taking him to task on his misbehavior. Later on, our teacher made an important distinction: "**It is good to be bold, but remaining respectful is important.**" Suffice it to say, while it is acceptable to be bold, there is no room for irreverence or "cheekiness."

Scripture is coloured with many **bold folks**. I find it particularly heartening to study the lives of those who were not bold on their own but allowed God to make them so!

Moses, for example, thought of himself as **inarticulate**. Yet, God worked in him, and Moses stood up. Moses **spent a ton of time** in God's counsel (nearly a year at Mt Sinai). When it came time to move on, Moses said to God, "**please show me your ways so that I may know you...because I will not go unless you go with us**" (Ex. 33:13). God replies: "**My Presence will go with you, and I will give you rest**" (Ex 33:14). Moses wanted not only to know God, but he wanted God to direct his every move.

In the New Testament, again, there were many who allowed Jesus to reform them. With tremendous boldness and humility, a centurion came to Jesus **appealing for help** for Jesus to **help his servant!** Amazingly, the centurion pleads for a person who, in that day, and under normal circumstances would be of little or no concern to him. Yet he engaged Jesus and even explains the power and authority that his position as centurion would bring. Then the centurion said this: "**Lord, I am not worthy to have you come under my roof, just say the word, and my servant will be healed.**" Matthew 8:8). Not only did Jesus heal but, **He marveled at the Centurion's faith.**


The preceding examples encourage us to come to God **as we are**, because of, and despite our circumstances. Both Moses and the Centurion found that the Lord was both approachable and interested in them. Jesus was also able and willing to work in them and through their situations.


What does *your* approach to God look like? Do you wonder if God cares? Are you skeptical? I encourage you to reflect on your approach to God and ask Him to meet you where you are. **He will join you and lead you into a deeper understanding of who He is and what He is doing.**


As we approach Lent, I encourage you to be intentional in **developing your relationship with God.**
