


FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH

Matt. 5: 13-20 (NRSVUE) [Jesus said:] ¹³ “You are the salt of the earth, but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything but is thrown out and trampled under foot. ¹⁴ “You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. ¹⁵ People do not light a lamp and put it under the bushel basket; rather, they put it on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. ¹⁶ In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven.

¹⁷ “Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have come not to abolish but to fulfill. ¹⁸ For truly I tell you, until heaven and earth pass away, not one letter, not one stroke of a letter, will pass from the law until all is accomplished. ¹⁹ Therefore, whoever breaks one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. ²⁰ For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.”

1 Cor. 2:1-12 (NRSVUE) ¹ When I came to you, brothers and sisters, I did not come proclaiming the testimony of God to you with superior speech or wisdom. ² For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. ³ And I came to you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling. ⁴ My speech and my proclamation were made not with persuasive words of wisdom but with a demonstration of the Spirit and of power, ⁵ so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God.

⁶ Yet among the mature we do speak wisdom, though it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are being destroyed. ⁷ But we speak God’s wisdom, a hidden mystery, which God decreed before the ages for our glory ⁸ and which none of the rulers of this age understood, for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. ⁹ But, as it is written,

“What no eye has seen, nor ear heard,
nor the human heart conceived,
what God has prepared for those who love him”—

¹⁰ God has revealed to us through the Spirit, for the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God. ¹¹ For what human knows what is truly human except the human spirit that is within? So also no one comprehends what is truly God’s except the Spirit of God. ¹² Now we have received not the spirit of the world but the Spirit that is from God, so that we may understand the gifts bestowed on us by God.

We want to be *in* the spotlight, but Jesus gives us a spot to *be* light.

Jesus insists he does not come to abolish God's law, but to fulfill it. Accused of breaking the commandment to rest by encouraging his disciples to harvest grain to eat and heal on the sabbath (*Matthew 12:1-4*), Jesus makes clear that to fulfill God's law is to live out its purpose rather than to follow rules by rote.

If we follow God's law only to gain personal rewards, it is possible to use even God's law for selfish sinful purposes.

United with Christ, Jesus' righteousness becomes our own so that trusting we have a place in the heavenly kingdom, we can follow God's law – not for personal gain, but for love of God and our neighbor. In this way, we experience the kingdom of heaven now.

When have you kept the letter of the law, but not its spirit? When have you kept the spirit of the law by violating its letter?

What is your goal when you play a sport or a game? What is your goal when you live out God's commandments?

How can you use the places Jesus puts you this week to shine God's light on others?
