



HOPE IN THE COLD: Bethel Bible Church Warming Center

The Warming Centre is an outreach that is growing from the hearts of members in our church family. They have expressed their desire to help those struggling with basic needs in our community. The ministry started with the support Pastor Andrew was already providing to the people who came through our doors. We are slowly and prayerfully building this outreach. Currently we are open Mondays and Wednesdays from 10am-2pm, and hope to grow as the demand presents itself. We have two volunteers present per session that have been approved through the Bethel Volunteer and Vulnerable training (including police checks) . Our volunteers are welcoming people into the foyer and offering a warm and welcoming space. Coffee and a microwave are available for food preparation . If there are interested volunteers, you can reach out to the volunteer coordinator Scarlet Swan to get accredited through the vulnerable sector policy guidelines. We have placed a security button in place that rings in the office to offer extra security. We have an easily accessible list of social services and other volunteer phone numbers handy in case they are needed.



The People and the needs

A committee was formed mid-January and are actively working to make this a fruitful ministry. The committee is made up of: Dave Devries, John Blanchard, Lori Miller, Melodie Brown, Peggy Hulley, and Susan Blanchard. We are still in the early stages of developing this ministry and welcome any questions you may have. - coffee
- single use shampoos and body wash
- Jerry clothes
- Socks and mitts
- First aid kit supplies

You can either give your donations to Susan or place them in the box in the foyer labeled, "Warming Centre".

We had a great conversation with Andrea from Exeter's Noah's Ark at the Pentecostal Church. We are looking into possibly modelling parts of their ministry from what works for them. Options we are prayerfully exploring as possibilities for the future are: - expanded hours - providing hot food in some capacity - hygiene and laundry centre - a thrift store area that models closely what Noah's ark is doing, including running by donation only. On February 28th, we will be hosting Coldest Night of the Year. Dave Devries will be our Captain and our main contact for the event with United Way. It is a fundraising event for United Way that supports local projects and starts with a walk at 9:30 around town. It ends with a light lunch at Bethel.
