WORD: We Hear God in Scripture & Preaching

Children's Message

Scripture readings adapted from *The Inclusive Bible*.

Isaiah 58:1-9...Shout for all you are worth, raise your voice like a trumpet! Proclaim to the people their faults, tell the house of Leah and Rachel and Jacob their sins! ² They seek me daily, they long to know my ways, like a nation that wants to act with integrity and not ignore the Law of its God. They ask me for laws that are just, they long for God to draw near. ³ Yet they say, "Why should we fast, if you never see it? Why do penance, if you never notice?" Because when you fast, it's business as usual, and you oppress all your workers! ⁴ Because when you fast, you quarrel and fight and strike the poor with your fist. Fasting like yours today will never make your voice heard on high! ⁵ Is that the sort of fast that pleases me - a day when people humiliate themselves, hanging their head like a reed, lying down on sackcloth and ashes? Is that what you call fasting, a day acceptable to Yahweh? ⁶ On the contrary! This is the sort of fast that pleases me: Remove the chains of injustice! Undo the ropes of the yoke! Let those who are oppressed go free, and break every yoke you encounter! ⁷ Share your bread with those who are hungry and shelter homeless poor people! Clothe those who are naked, and don't hide from the needs of your own flesh and blood! ⁸ Do this and your light will shine like the dawn—and your healing will break forth like lightning! Your integrity will go before you, and the glory of Yahweh will be your rear guard. ⁹ Cry, and Yahweh will answer; Call and God will say, "I am here." Word of God, word of life. **Thanks be to God.**

Psalms 112...Alleluia! Happiness comes to those who revere Yahweh, who greatly delight in God's commands. ² Their children hold power on earth; the descendants of the just will be blessed. ³ There will be riches and wealth for their families, and God's justice can never be changed. ⁴ For the just, Yahweh shines like a lamp in the dark; God is merciful, compassionate and righteous. ⁵ Good people are generous, and lend money without interest; they are honest in all their dealings. ⁶ They are never shaken, because they love justice and will leave an imperishable memory behind them. ⁷ They never fear bad news, because their unwavering hearts trust in Yahweh. ⁸ With peaceful hearts, they fear nothing; and in the end they will look in triumph over their enemies. ⁹ Quick to be generous, they give to the poor, doing justice always and forever; their horn will always be lifted in honor. ¹⁰ The corrupt

become infuriated when they see this; they grind their teeth and waste away, finally vanishing like their empty dreams.
