### **John 18:19–23**

Jesus does not panic. Does not retaliate. Does not perform.

He simply speaks truth.

## **Greek Insight**

Witness — μαρτυρία (martyria)

To testify from lived reality.

Truth is not just spoken. It is lived out.

How does your life testify about Jesus under pressure?

### **III. Fear Speaks Loud — But Grace Speaks Last**

#### **John 18:25–27**

Peter denies again. And again. And again.

Then the rooster crows.

Failure is exposed. But not final.

#### **Study Insight**

Jesus already knew.

And He already planned restoration.

Where do you still carry shame Jesus has already paid for?
