

1. Part One: Internal Strain, Spirit-Led Wisdom

What does this text reveal about Jesus' mission, authority, and promises?

- Observations from the text; Key words / phrases that stand out; What does this tell us about Jesus today, not just then?

 - b. **Ordering Ministry for Faithfulness (2-4)**
 - c. **Sharing Leadership, Trusting the Spirit (5-7)**

2. Part Two: Stephen—A Faithful Servant

Where is God acting, moving, empowering, disrupting, or directing?

- How does the Spirit show up in this passage? What changes because the Spirit is present? What assumptions or expectations are challenged?
 - a. **Faithfulness not Fame (8)**
 - b. **Opposition follows Faithfulness (9-14)**
 - c. **Faithfulness reflects Jesus (15)**

11. Where might Jesus be asking us to wait, pray, speak, or move?
12. Who in our lives might God be drawing toward Himself through us?
