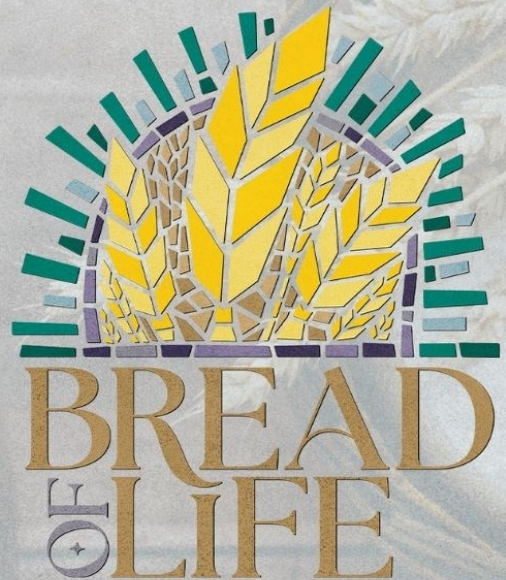

From Our Pastor

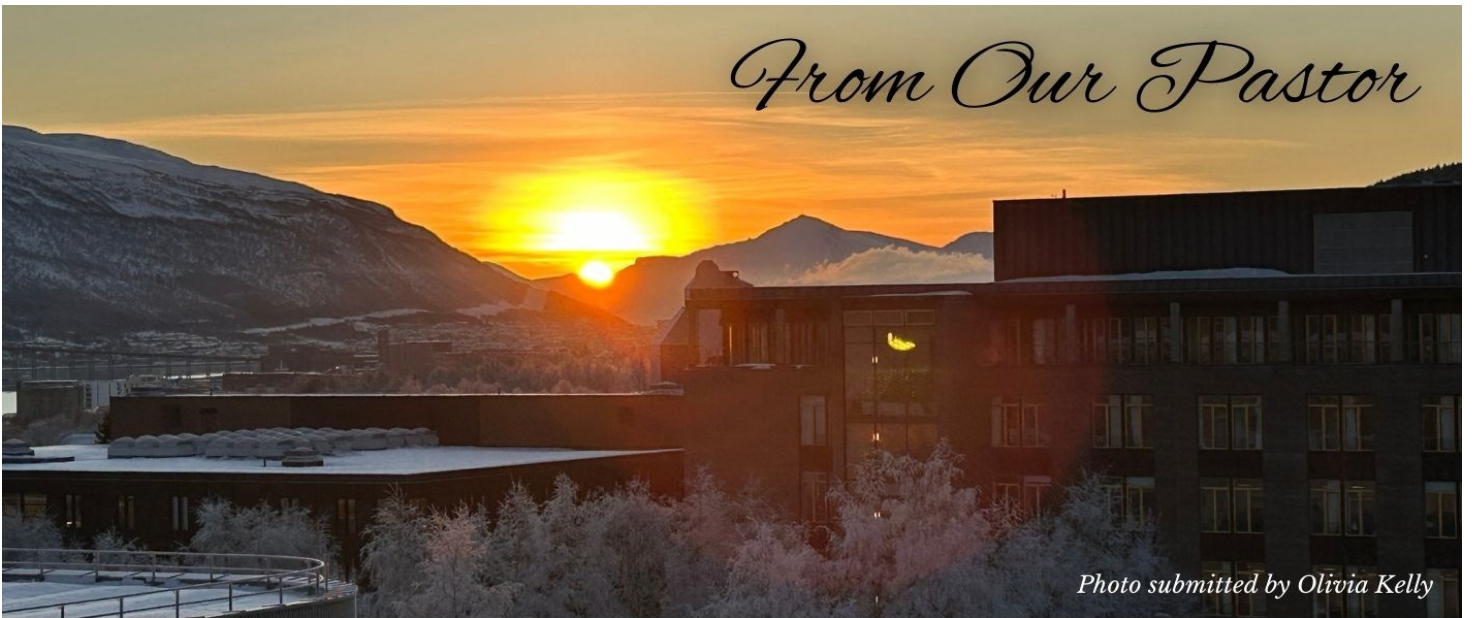

Dear friends,

Christina Rosetti wrote the beautifully haunting words to the Christmas song, “In the Bleak Midwinter,”

*In the bleak midwinter, frosty wind made moan,
Earth stood hard as iron, water like a stone;
Snow had fallen, snow on snow, snow on snow
In the bleak midwinter, long ago*

I feel this song in my bones in January. Christmas is past and we are in the heart of Epiphany on our way to Lent. Here in Fergus Falls we are steadily gaining daylight with each passing day and I know our bleak midwinter, with all this snow, is easing forward as many of us look toward Spring.

My older daughter left to study at the Arctic University of Norway in Tromsø the beginning of January. She arrived in the time in which the sun did not rise in Tromsø. We think about Alaska and northern Norway as the Land of the Midnight Sun – but with that distinction, the inverse is also true. While there was a bit of light during this Polar Night, there was no sun.

And then on January 21, the people of Tromsø rejoiced. It was the Day of the Sun and for the first time in weeks the sun rose above the horizon. The university students celebrated with doughnuts that are dubbed “sun buns,” grateful for the return of that reddish orange ball in the sky. The SUN had returned.

As we leave Christmas and head into Lent, we wait for the SON - God’s son, Jesus. Rosetti’s second stanza of her poem begins, “*Heaven cannot hold him, nor earth sustain; heav’n and earth shall flee away when he comes to reign.*” Many of us long for the concreteness of Jesus in the flesh to ease our anxious hearts or our pain. While not always visible, perhaps each morning when the sun arises, we should rejoice that the son of God did arise. The Son of God who takes away the sins of the world meets us each day – whether the sun is visible or not. Even in places that the sun does not rise, we know the light of Christ shines in both the physical and the figurative darkness and the darkness has not overcome it (John 1:5).

We celebrate the Day of the SON every Sunday as we come together to worship God. We even have Sun Buns (doughnuts) though ours aren’t the biscuit type they have in Norway. They will do just fine. You are invited, to get some new light in your life. Come worship the SON, and he will drive out the darkness with love.
