Registration

Who is Invited?

This event is designed for **high school youth in grades 9-12**. (students entering 9th grade for the 26-27 school year - 2026 high school graduates are eligible). All registrations must be made with a congregational youth group.

Adult chaperones may not bring their own children under the age designated for this event.

Program Cost

The cost is \$150 per person, which includes program, lodging and seven meals while at Lutherwood, and a may youth weekend t-shirt.

Registration Policies

- 100% payment is due **by check** within 2 weeks of your registration to reserve your spots.
- There is no charge to change names on a registration before April 15th, 2026.
- Registration will close on April 15th, 2026.
- All participants age 18+ will need to complete a background check through their congregation.
- Group leaders are responsible for carrying completed registration forms with emergency information for each member of their group. Use the May Youth Weekend form or what your congregation requires.
- To request a refund, send a letter of explanation to the holdenmyw17@gmail.com before April 15, 2026.

No refunds will be issued after this date.

You will be required to enter information for each student and adult who plan to attend including name/pronouns/birthdate/grade/t-shirt size/allergies

Medical Release and Covenant of Conduct Forms

Be sure to list any special needs (physical, medical, dietary, etc.) in your online registration.

When you come to Lutherwood, you must bring any and all forms required by your church regarding health insurance, liability, permission, etc. The forms provided by May Youth Weekends qualify. You must also submit your background check form prior to the event via email. (This is a form stating that you have completed background checks for each adult in your party and release Lutherwood and May Youth Weekends of liability - you do not need to submit the results to MYW nor bring the results with you unless your church requires this).

The Covenant of Conduct forms the group's "contract" for the event. Please make sure your youth and accompanying adults understand the expectations required of them while participating.

Getting Ready

Housing: Lutherwood has cabins with bunk beds that sleep about 20 people each. Bathrooms are located in a separate building nearby. Male and female participants will be in separate cabins. Adults will be housed in the cabins with youth and there will likely be more than one church group per cabin. PARTICIPANTS MUST BRING THEIR OWN LINENS INCLUDING BEDDING & TOWELS.

Check in Beginning at 11am on Saturday, May 23 with lunch at Noon

Check in with Nicole and get your group's folder containing detailed schedules, your housing assignments, devotions and other materials for the weekend.

What to Expect: The event will include several large group gatherings with our special guest speaker and musician, small groups, evening sacred space, service projects, lots of fun free time opportunities (including swimming and boating!), and collaborative closing worship.

Meals: The camp will provide lunch and dinner on the day of arrival, three meals on the second day, and breakfast and lunch on the day of departure. Many special dietary needs can be accommodated. Please list them during registration.

Items that produce fire or sparks (lighters, etc.)
